

# Ak-Chin students enjoy 2021 graduation ceremonies

To say we've come a long way since March 2020, is such an understatement, especially for those who have had to make numerous adjustments this past year. Students in particular, have had to bounce back and forth, from being home schooled, returning to in person learning, and then the roller coaster quarantine that kept them out of school and stuck at home for what seemed like forever.

They also missed out on socializing with their friends, and the opportunity to participate in school activities, clubs and sports, which may have also hindered a possible scholarship. Some even experienced COVID on a personal level, and some also had family tragedies due to the pandemic. It was a very rough

year for our students. But now, it is time to gather together and celebrate their achievements.

The Community is extremely proud and honored to say "CONGRATULATIONS" to the many Ak-Chin students who worked so hard to be able to participate in their graduation ceremonies. In all, we had over fifty students walk across their school stages recently and receive diplomas for promotion and graduation. A long list of eighth graders will soon be joining the high school ranks and over 20 high school students turned their tassels and will soon be looking towards a bright future, with diploma in hand.

Ak-Chin Advisor-Tutor, Matthew Tess had the opportunity to attend the graduation ceremony for Community member, Jilayne Miguel.

"I attended the Betty Fairfax ceremony at the Veteran's Coliseum in Phoenix on May 20th and the Phoenix Union Native Graduation Celebration on May 15th. The Native Graduation Celebration was very well done. It was good to see Phoenix Union recognize their Native students in a private ceremony (outside of the individual school celebrations)." Matt shared.

"Our very own Jilayne Miguel even spoke during the ceremony. As for Betty Fairfax, it was good to see students graduate in-person again. Due to the graduation being "invite only", the Coliseum had screens set up in

the parking lots for extended family."

Matt was also on hand to witness our eighth graders promote at Maricopa Wells Middle School on May 24th and Desert Wind Middle School on May 25, at the Maricopa High School football Field.

"It was a good ceremony to celebrate the promoting 8th graders and a lot of comments about the relationship between Maricopa Unified and Ak-Chin over the years... One thing that stuck out the most was the retirement of David Foster; a teacher who had an extensive impact not only on the students he taught but, on the staff, as well."

May 26 was the big day for

all seniors graduating from Maricopa High School. It was extra special for our Native students as well, as Ak-Chin Language Program and former Vice-Chairman Gabriel Lopez were asked by Ak-Chin Student Counselor Teresa Valisto, to provide a blessing and sing a song, earlier that day.

Ak-Chin Chairman Robert Miguel also participated in the Maricopa high school and middle school ceremonies, speaking to the students about their future and success. He was on hand to give diplomas to all Ak-Chin students.

Many graduates paid tribute to a loved one during the ceremony, like Reginald Delores who had pictures of his late mother Paulina Delores

On March 26, 2020, the Ak-Chin Indian Community issued a declaration entitled "Declaration of the Ak-Chin Indian Community Proclaiming a State of Emergency Due to the COVID-19 Outbreak."

In addition to the March 2020 Declaration, many Orders of the Chairman were issued. On June 17, 2020, the Chairman ordered a limitation on large events and mass gatherings of no more than (10) people, which was amended on July 1, to include and establish a curfew.

Even though the Community of Ak-Chin

is smaller than many of the other Arizona tribes, adhering to the strict limitations and restrictions was very challenging, especially for our elders who relied on face to face communication, while others utilized phone technology and social media to keep in contact. Another Order that struck hard with the youth was the Order issued on April 8, 2020 directing the closure of the Ak-Chin Indian Community Parks and Recreational Facilities. The Chairman

Community Parks and Recreational Facilities.
The Chairman implemented another Order on March 1, 2021, amending the June 17, 2020 order to prohibit

wakes and establish new and additional Ak-Chin Cemetery and Burial Procedures. This Order was extremely devasting to those who lost family members during the peak of COVID, as funerals were kept to a minimum and wakes were forbidden.

With questions from the membership on reopening and lifting restrictions and the significant progress that has been made with COVID testing and the abundant availability of the COVID vaccines, Ak-Chin Council is now moving forward to slowly and safely open

up the Community.

# **Opening up Ak-Chin**

"Right now, the Community has moved in lifting certain orders that were in place during the height of the pandemic." Chairman Robert Miguel shared.

Council, the Ak-Chin Incident Management Team and staff from Gila River Health Care have been instrumental in providing information and recommendations for a safe reopening that is in the best interest of the Community's health.

One of the first things Council addressed was ending the Partial Closure for Community departments, had been extended for several months. On May 17, 2021, employees were to return to work at Phase I or 50% status. They also provided a return to work policy for their departments. Many departments have had staff working on a regular basis, such as fire, police, Vekol Market, Sanitation and Elder Program.

Council has graciously

allowed Administrative Leave pay for all full-time community employees since January 2021. They also paid Community, Harrah's and UltraStar (now Ak-Chin Circle) employees Admin with when the community first closed, from March to May, 2020.

Council has also rescinded the order directing the closure of Ak-Chin Parks and Recreational facilities, as well as "allowing community gatherings, full wakes and funerals to continue, normal hours curfew enterprises opening at 100% just to name a few." Chairman stated. "All of this is to move forward of course with safety guidelines that are still in place. This is not the full opening that we were accustomed to prior to the pandemic, that familiar opening will not occur until we receive recommendations guidance from the CDC and other sources that community

continued to work with

thus far."

With the reopening of Community departments, Ak-Chin Recreation has announced the pool is open as well as the facility by appointment only. The Him-Dak Museum Arts Program and Ak-Chin Child Development have announced summer classes. Ak-Chin Circle is opening more movie theatres and extending their hours. Harrah's and Ak-Chin Circle have also advertised for future entertainment.

Council has been very diligent in keeping the Community safe, and asks for the Community to do this same.

understand the urgency of wanting to move forward with opening at 100%, but the community and membership have done tremendous job of abiding to and understanding policies, guidelines and procedures in place for over a year now."

Elders and Caregivers who participated will receive a graduation certificate and a parting gift!

The last couple of years the Elder Center has partnered with the University of Arizona Cooperative Extension to provide their Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program. (EFNEP)

included a test. The test was

returned each Friday for credit.

This year we had over a dozen

Elders who participated and

Elders who returned the test received a prize. A few of the items they earned included a set of measuring cups and spoons, a meat thermometer, and a snack cup and sandwich spreader.

We would like to thank the Elders who participated. This assists the Center in fulfilling the nutrition education requirements for our grants.

Next month we will be concentrating on getting our Caregivers recertified in CPR and First Aid. Watch for a notice and call in to sign up. Classes will be limited with Covid restrictions and precautions.

Depending on the level of interest, we will hold them weekly or bi-weekly until we get all our unpaid Caregivers and Grandparents raising Grandchildren certified.

If you are a paid caregiver you can sign up on a reserve list and we will contact you if we have room for an extra participant.
