July Community Meeting

On July 26th, Ak-Chin Community Council hosted its monthly community meeting via WebEx. Since the turn out of the virtual meetings has boosted, the meetings will continue to take place virtually, until in person meetings are approved.

First presenter of the evening was Bart Smith, Community Operations Manager. Bart shared his notes on the July 27th and 28th Covid-19 Testing Blitz. He pointed out how all testers would receive an Ak-Chin Entertainment Gift Card. He then announced to the Community that if they had missed picking up their school supplies from the Back to School events for their students that they are still available by appointment at the Education Department.

Bart then talked about the Ak-Chin Elder Center having breakfast and lunch in-person, starting on Wednesdays and Thursdays and will continue to have meals delivered to elder homes. The department will have to limit seating due to the current Covid-19 cases,

Story by J. Peters the sit-down meals will be available by appointment only, at a max of 10 people allowed per meal. He encouraged to book a spot in early! Elder and/or caregivers can book an appointment with the Elder Center. Staff can also arrange a ride to and from the Elder Center with the help of the Transit Department.

Once Bart had finished, he turned the meeting over to Council, who called upon the IMT (Incident Management Team).

Team Leader/Community Services Manager Nicole Carlyle-Coester, provided introductions of the team. Operation Chief position is Chief Manuel Garcia, Planning Chief is Marc Matteson, Logistics is Wayne Allison, Finance Administrative is Diana Garcia, Safety Coordinator is Clifford Myers, **Emergency Operation Center** (EOC) Manager is Glenn Boothe and Deputy EOC is Keith Franklin.

Marc Matteson, introduced himself and gave a

July 16, 2021, many gathered for the dedication ceremony opening of the Tower D building, which is an expansion to the existing Chandler Regional Medical Center.

The Tower D expansion will add 230,000sf, including new main entrance, five stories plus basement, and provide outpatient services, operating rooms, cardiac rehabilitation, infusion, telemetry and chapel.

Ak-Chin, was among

the many sponsors who participated in the event.

The proceeds that where accumulated to fund the tower came from a donation from Ak-Chin to Chandler Regional, from the Proposition 202 12% contribution allocated grant process, stipulated through the Tribal Gaming Compact.

Chandler Regional was a 2019 applicant of the 12% contribution process. Upon review and approval of the application by Council,

Chandler Regional was awarded the allocated funds for the project.

"The significance of the contribution is to solidify the relations between Chandler Regional and the Ak-Chin Community which reflects in many aspects. The main focus for contributing to the project is to aid in delivering more efficient as well as sufficient medical care not only for our members but for the public in general." shared Lemuel Vincent, Ak-Chin Vice-Chairman.

Secretary Buttigieg meets with Arizona Tribal Leaders

In efforts to strengthening relationships in all matters between Tribal Nations and the Biden Administration, Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg held around table discussion with Tribal Leaders from throughout Arizona.

The meeting took place on Thursday, July 15th at the Sheraton Grand at Wild Horse Pass Casino Resort on the Gila River Indian Community.

The primary focus of the meeting was to receive infrastructure comments and testimony of needs from Tribal Communities in Arizona and

the surrounding cities that are affected by continued needs.

"All Tribal Communities in Arizona have infrastructure from maintenance, needs paving, flooding mitigations, and other areas of requirements so it was a priority to have Secretary of Transportation Buttigieg here in person listening to our concerns," said Chairman Miguel. "We've always echoed to our State Representatives from D.C. that in order for the administration to better understand our needs, they needed to come and visit our communities in person."

Following roundtable discussions, Chairman Miguel, Gila River Indian Community Governor Stephen Lewis-Roe and City of Maricopa

Mayor Christian Price were able to continue thoughts of road improvements within an intersection shared by all three parties.

The section of State Route 347 and Riggs Road was visited by the group and discussions continued with the two Tribal Leaders, Maricopa City Mayor and Buttigieg on potential support in funding of an added overpass to the intersection.

"We extremely were appreciative of Secretary Buttigieg's time in visiting one of the more dangerous intersections within communities," respective Chairman Miguel stated. "347 and Riggs is definitely a priority when it comes seeking infrastructure dollars to support continued improvements in a safe route for commuters to go and come into Maricopa."

Following his Arizona stint, Secretary Buttigieg continued his journey in visiting Tribal Nations throughout the Southwestern and Pacific coast areas.

Prior to becoming United States Secretary of Transportation, Secretary Buttigieg was the 32nd Mayor of South Bend, Indiana from 2012 to 2020 and ran as a candidate for President of the United States in the 2020 Democratic Party Presidential Primaries. presentation on what his roll is yourself on IMT. As planning segment members of the team, which receives or have input/output data and reports for the operations of the team, Marc puts together a weekly becoming snapshot of the current status.

The snapshot includes, the total current cases of COVID, how many homes are under quarantine, stats of the community and other related information etc. It also includes the state data and local ZIP Code data from neighboring counties around the community.

Marc provided a vaccination summary, exclaiming as of Thursday, July 22, Ak-Chin has 446 total community members vaccinated with at least one dose and 402 community members who have been fully vaccinated. 80% of community elders (55+) are fully vaccinated, ages 35-55 is sitting just under 47%.

Presenting next was Chief Garcia, who shared his primary responsibilities are preparation and responses for anything the community may encounter. Whether it is events within the community itself or recurring events (ex: vaccination events) he is finding ways for things to be done safely.

Chief Garcia then talked about 72-hour preparedness within the community itself, and mentions that although this presentation on "72-hour Preparedness" is relating to COVID-19, it will also apply to anything and everything that could occur here in the community outside the virus. As an example of the massive power outage that our sister tribe Gila River experienced as one of the many events that Ak-Chin community could be prepared and have the right approach to handling these and other situations.

Chief Garcia explained that this specific 72 Preparedness presentation is specifically geared towards quarantining and Covid-19. He encouraged everyone to think about planning ahead, preparing yourself, your family and your home in case of an event that you and your family may have to quarantine for a period of time.

Quarantining is isolating

yourself and any family members that have COVID or have been exposed to COVID in your household. It's protecting others from becoming infected and isolating those impacted.

In the event you or your household are put into quarantine, there are some steps to take to prepare for a 72-hour (3 day) quarantine. Ak-Chin Indian Community All Hazard Emergency Operations Plan Residents of the Ak-Chin Indian Community should be self-sufficient for the first 72 hours of any disaster.

Below is a list of suggestions for planning to create your household quarantine kit in the event you are put under quarantine:

Food – Purchase canned foods that will not spoil and have a long shelf life. Select items that your family likes. Canned products could include meat products, fish, beans, soups, broths, stews, fruits, fruit juice, vegetables, powdered milk. Frozen foods are also an option to have on hand. Other foods to consider are peanut butter, jelly, crackers, nuts, trail mix, dried fruits, granola bars, bouillon cubes. Other staples to have on hand are sugar, salt, pepper.

Baby food and supplies – you may have special needs for your babies and children. Be aware of this and prepare ahead. Also consider diapers, baby wipes, and any formula needed for baby.

Family members with special diet needs – plan ahead and stock up for any special needs of any family members.

Water and liquids – the CDC recommend you keep plenty of fluids on hand such as bottled water and liquids with electrolytes such as Pedialyte or Gatorade. Plan enough for at least 72 hours for all family members and stock up on items.

Medicine – Consider all of the family medical needs and any medicine that will be needed to cover a 14-day period. Even better plan for a 30-day supply.

Supplies – Keep supplies on hand such as cleaning supplies, masks, hand sanitizer, wipes, hand soap, toilet paper, paper towels, dish soap, trash bags, disinfectant spray, laundry soap, tissue, bleach, gloves, and other essential supplies


members and residents who got tested on those days. "Our numbers testing just dropped and I think we can't let our guard down" says Councilmember Delia Carlyle.


Prompted by a question asked during meeting, Council decided to announce to the membership, through the American Rescue Plan, the Council was able and decided that a monetary incentive provided would be membership participation in getting fully vaccinated for COVID-19.

All fully-vaccinated members will be eligible for a one-time \$2000 payout, as long as they meet the criteria and stipulations.

Community members that are minors who have been fully-vaccinated will be eligible for the payout as well, although, their money will be placed into their trust accounts.

Not just a theory: Block play builds STEM skills in early childhood

AK-CHIN (July 27, 2021) Young Albert Einstein spent a lot of time playing with blocks. It sparked his imagination and helped develop his scientific mind.

Now, more than a century after his revolutionary theories of relativity were published, there's growing evidence that playing with blocks helps young kids develop the skills needed for careers in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).

You could buy Einstein's very own blocks, (price: \$180,000 plus shipping), but any ordinary set will do. Either way, your child will get the same developmental benefits.

How do blocks build STEM

skills in early childhood?

There's no guarantee your little one will grow up to be a world-famous physicist, but it's not just a theory that playing with building blocks helps kids learn about things like shape, size, location, distance and direction.

Young children learn about these concepts — known as spatial awareness through movement, exploration and play.

Block play is especially

good for spatial learning because it provides opportunities for kids to move and arrange objects and see what happens. Each tower that rises and falls is an experiment in how things in the physical world relate to each other.

But it may be the language shared between children and their adult caregivers during block play that's the key. Researchers are finding that understanding spatial vocabulary — words "above," "below," "next to," "inside," "over" and "through" — could be what fuels kid's abilities and interest in math and science later on in school. And studies show that children learn to use more spatial language when playing with blocks than when not.

Does early math matter?

Some recent studies show that spatial learning developed in block play relates to math learning as early as age 3. Could that really matter in the



long run? Statistically, yes, because students who start kindergarten with stronger math skills go on to do better in elementary school math. And kids who do better in elementary school math are much more likely to graduate from high school and attend college.

Gross Motor activities to help your child grow and learn

Your child is improving skills using his leg and arm muscles. He is working on making these muscles stronger, more flexible, and more coordinated. He can catch an 8-inch ball, jump about 2 feet, make sharp turns around a corner while running, and avoid obstacles in his path.

When playing outside, place a towel or piece of cloth about 2 feet wide on the grass. This is the "river." Have your child run and jump over the river without "getting wet." At first, you can fold the towel so that the river is not so wide. Then, you can make it bigger. Watch out for alligators!

Let your child kick a balloon from one end of the room to the other. Lay a box on its side for a goal. See if she can kick the balloon into the box.
