"This is a tremendously exciting day for the entire Ak-Chin Indian Community," said Ak-Chin Chairman Robert Miguel.



As dictated by a new state law, the Arizona Department of Gaming allocated 10 sports betting licenses to tribes, which are entitled to partner with a third party to develop and operate their sportsbook and mobile app.

"We are thrilled to partner with Ak-Chin for a market access agreement in Arizona," Scott Butera, president, Fubo Gaming. "Our comprehensive experience will combine real-money wagering with fuboTV's live sports offering for a seamless user experience enabling consumers to wager while they watch. Arizonans are passionate professional and collegiate sports fans who we believe will enjoy the market defining Fubo Sportsbook."

Sportsbooks permitted to begin marketing activities and signing-up Arizona customers immediately. The first sports wagers can be placed Sept. 9, 2021.

Monday August 30th, Ak-Chin Tribal Council met the membership, via WebEx for the monthly Community Meeting. The virtual meeting started rolling with Chairman Robert Miguel saying a prayer before the presentations began.

A joint presentation was provided by Community Manager, Operations Bart Smith and Capitol Projects Director, Perry Vettraino who started off the meeting by giving a small introduction about the current plans and construction ongoing Cemetery with the Improvement Project.

They ensured members that use of the cemetery will not be prohibited construction is in motion and the Community continue to have full access to the cemetery during the project's continuation.

They also noted that the construction teams accommodating and respecting community and its members by postponing their work for funerals and special events/holidays such as; All Souls Day on November 2nd.

Project Manager, Casey

Turgeon also provided a PowerPoint presentation the Cemetery Improvement Project.

It included a map showing members the project's construction zone displays, layout and building representation of how the project will look when completed.

The project will include restrooms that being constructed on the West-side of the cemetery, alongside an open recreational-style building with filtrated air, non-air conditioned.

The building will be

approximately square feet, featuring 4 stalls in the women's restroom and 2 stalls and a urinal in the men's.

The building will also include a storage area that will be 200 square feet, which will be used for tables, chairs, and essentials for ceremonial needs.

Full Approval for Pfizer Is Another Reason to **Get Vaccinated Today Against COVID-19**

All COVID-19 vaccines have undergone thorough reviews for safety and efficacy

PHOENIX If the "emergency authorization" use has kept you from vaccinated getting against COVID-19, it's time to join millions Arizonans protected themselves, their families, and their communities by getting a life-saving jab.

The Food and Drug Administration, in a critical step toward ending the pandemic, granted today full approval for the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine to prevent COVID-19 in those 16 and older.

It will be marketed under the brand name Comirnaty. This vaccine

remains available to ages 12 to 15 under an FDA emergency use authorization.

"My sincere hope is that today's welcome news from the FDA helps remove a barrier for many Arizonans who are hesitant to get the vaccine," Governor Doug Ducey said.

"There's never been a better reason to join me and the nearly 4 million people in our state who have received these safe, free, and highly effective vaccines."

During July and the first half of August, better than 86% of COVID-19 cases have occurred

among those who aren't vaccinated. general, fully vaccinated individuals who still COVID-19 will have milder and sometimes even symptoms. Meanwhile, 91% of those hospitalized during July and 86% of those who died from COVID-19 in July weren't fully vaccinated.

"Over the decades, vaccines have brought to heel polio, smallpox, tetanus, whooping cough, measles, many other concerning diseases," said Dr. Cara Christ, director of the Department Arizona Services of Health

The approved COVID-19 vaccines, which benefit from 20 years research into coronaviruses, offer the surest protection against a virus that continues hospitalizing and killing those who aren't vaccinated."

If you think being a young adult guarantees your safety even if you aren't vaccinated, think again. Nearly half of all cases are occurring among those ages 20 to 44, the group with the lowest vaccination rates among adults.

Nearly one out of three people hospitalized for COVID-19 since June have been ages 20 to 44. That's 1,583 people



from what should be the fittest age group being hospitalized and facing severe illness and even death. Sadly, 12% of COVID-19 deaths – 54 people - reported from June to present have been ages 20 to 44.

The Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson/ Janssen vaccines are widely available across

the 4-foot fence will be a deco mesh style, similar to the fencing outside the B.I.A. House. The South parking area will have decomposed compacted, granite driveways, include 51 parking spaces and 5 handicap spaces. The North parking area will have 12 parking spaces and 2 handicap spaces.

Anticipated completion date for the Cemetery Improvement Project is December 24, 2021, but could be subjected to change if any unforeseen events should occur.

After the presentation Council gave their updates starting Chairman with Robert Miguel.

He mentioned an upcoming meeting with Tohono O'odham Nation about a preliminary future in healthcare; attending meeting with Massachusetts Congressman Jim McGovern and Hopi Chairman Timothy L. Nuvangyaoma; also having meetings with President and CEO, Mercy Gilbert and Chandler Regional Medical Mark Centers, Slyter; Harrah's; Arizona District Congressman Ruben Gallego; Capital Projects; MUSD and Maricopa Mayor Christian Price.

Chairman also talked about attending and speaking at the 2021 Arizona Water Law Conference with Governor Lewis of Gila River Indian Community, and speaking at the upcoming 13th Annual Tribal Casino and Hotel Development Conference, as well as working on updating various community codes and ordinances.

Councilmember Lisa Garcia shared COVID-19 numbers with the community (i.e. vaccinations, testing) informing members that vaccinations are available at the Ak-Chin Clinic; presenting at the U of A Water Recourses Research Center; attending a symposium on settlement of Indian reserve water rights; attending National Indian Gaming Conference; participated in discussion regarding Vekol Wash plan; working on updating various community codes and ordinances.

Councilmember Delia Carlyle talked about PRC (Purchase Referred Care); participated in a focus group with MUSD for the new high school; self-governance compacts and COVID Relief funds and audits; COVID testing and booster shots; and working on updating various community codes and ordinances.

Councilmember Octavio Machado talked about refocusing on community's efforts to increasing benefit programs, services and jobs for community members. He also talked about the community's Emergency Rental Assistance Program, future apartment project, and working on updating

various community codes

and ordinances.


Meeting continued from Front
