



This month in honor of our community's caregivers we hosted our first in person training. It was facilitated by Celina Mahinalani Garza with AIM.


To follow Covid guidelines we provided two sessions.

Participants learned how to Take responsibility for their own care, manage stress, and create natural "medicine" for self-care. They learned how smells can influence mood, made their own personal essential oil, participated in guided meditation, and each participant painted a small canvas to take home.

Each participant went home with a medicine bag with Palo Santo Wood (Holy Wood) used for its energy cleansing benefits, White Sage used to remove negative energy, and Pa"akal (Sea Salt) for cleansing and to ward off evil.

All those who participated went away feeling relaxed, rejuvenated, and appreciated. Caregivers rarely get the recognition and appreciation they deserve. Our program does its best to provide support, training, and services to one of the Community's most important resources, The Unpaid Caregiver.
