2021 World Bench Press and Dead Lift Championships

The World Association of Benchers and Deadlifters (WABDL) had to relocate their 2021 World Bench Press and Dead Lift Championships, originally scheduled to be held in Reno, Nevada. WABDL said they were very fortunate to proceed with this year's Worlds at the Sheraton Phoenix Crescent Hotel, October 31-November 3, 2021.

Once WABDL was able to secure a location, they wanted to ensure a good turnout. Although, they had to scramble to make this major event happen, there was a decent turn out, with competitors from across the country, with lifters coming from as far as Hawaii to participate.

Ak-Chin's Powerlifting team was eager to compete in front of a hometown crowd and did extremely well, dominated in the 2021 Worlds. Ak-Chin had five out of the newly created 7-man team placing first in all three categories; bench, deadlift and push-pull.

Ak-Chin Powerlifters showed up bright and early on Sunday October 31 for their first sessions. They had great

numbers coming from their bench lifts and were more than ready for the next event.

Unfortunately, they were then challenged with a 2-hour delay. The team helped one another stay alert and stay in the zone for the deadlift. All in all, the team did very well keeping one another pumped up for the deadlift event by supporting and encouraging through the last sessions.

Each event had a series of three runs or attempts, after each successful attempt more weight would be added. If lifters successfully completed all three attempts they were given a fourth attempt. Once all lifters completed their final sessions scores were tallied and winners were announced.

It was a long and exhausting day for the lifters, but it was a great experience for the spectators as they could see the energy of each lifter when it was their turn. Teammates and coaches would help motivate upcoming lifters with encouraging shouts, chants and body slaps to get hyped up. There was an occasional sniff of ammonia to clear their nose and pull in more oxygen, allowing for them to breathe faster, increase their heart rate and release adrenaline.

During every Ak-Chin lift you could see teammates and coach Garette Langmead on the side giving an encouraging word, ensuring his lifters were ready and making sure their scores were tallied correctly.

All members of the Ak-Chin team were ready to break their personal best records and bring home medals.

"As a team our goal was to be able to compete and beat our old personal records, set new records and to get our names in the record books for Arizona." Team leader Nikolai White shared.

On Halloween evening, Team Ak-Chin did just that!

In addition to breaking their old records and setting new ones, Ak-Chin Powerlifters came out to the competition to get more recognition in the powerlifting community as well as other native communities.

They would also like to open more doors to older and younger people that might be interested in lifting weights or would like to become part of the team.

"Ak-Chin is the largest native group in AZ that we know of, we know there are native lifters, but mostly solo. I think we are the only native team." Nikolai stated.

Now that they have accomplished what they had set for themselves at this year's WABDL Worlds, Ak-Chin

Today marks one year since the first COVID-19 vaccine doses reached Arizona

One year ago today, Governor Ducey announced that Arizona had received its first doses of COVID-19 vaccine.

With safe, free, and highly effective COVID-19 vaccines readily available these days at retail pharmacies, doctors' offices, and community clinics, it seems long, long ago when the vaccine supply was extremely limited and the first doses were reserved for frontline healthcare workers.

On Dec. 16, 2020, our former director, Dr. Cara Christ, held an event at which nurses, doctors, and paramedics received the first doses of COVID-19 vaccine in Arizona. You can see the video here. Each of the participants shared why he or she was getting vaccinated, including Regina Villa, a Valleywise Health nurse manager who was the first.

"I'm getting the vaccine to help put a stop to this virus," Villa said. "I'm getting the vaccine to protect myself and my family, my co-workers at Valleywise Health, my patients, and to help us get back to living lives hugging each other and loving each other."

In the months that followed, millions of Arizonans rolled up their sleeves at locations including state-run vaccination sites that administered 1.6 million doses. Today, 64% of Arizonans have received at least one dose of COVID-19 vaccine and nearly 4 million have been fully vaccinated. Of those eligible

for vaccination in Arizona, 67.8% have received at least one dose.

Today, everyone ages 5 and older is now eligible for a lifesaving jab. And those 16 and older who are fully vaccinated are now encouraged to get a COVID-19 vaccine booster dose to ensure that their protection is up to

COVID-19 vaccines continue to prove their value. We recently reported that in October people who weren't vaccinated were 15.2 times more likely to die from COVID-19 than those who are fully vaccinated.

Even with the progress during the past year and success of the vaccines, hard work remains to persuade one out of three eligible Arizonans that it is in their best interest and the best interest of their families, friends, and communities to get vaccinated. While vaccinations have picked up since the summer surge began, our hospitals are straining to care for COVID-19 patients, the vast majority of whom are unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated.

Perhaps one way to move forward is remembering the excitement of that day one year ago when the first vaccines in Arizona gave us all hope of finally bringing COVID-19 to heel. Life has improved in many ways because of the protection offered by COVID-19 vaccines, and it can continue improving if we are all in this together.

ONE-YEAR ANNIVERSARY WITH NO DECISION FROM THE **ARIZONA SUPREME COURT** ON PINAL COUNTY'S VOTER **APPROVED ½ CENT SALES TAX** FOR CRITICAL TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE

Florence, AZ, December 10, 2021

In November of 2017, the voters of Pinal County approved a sales tax to address the need for new, expanded transportation upgraded corridors and public transportation programs throughout Pinal County.

Regional Transportation Authority readies to launch \$672 million voter authorized program in Pinal County.

The Pinal Regional Transportation Authority representing government entities across Pinal County has been actively working since December of 2017 to prepare for a successful launch of the \$672 million voter-approved 20-year regional transportation plan. The Authority has worked diligently to put in place the plans and necessary Intergovernmental Agreements that will allow our local governments to carry out the direction of the Pinal County voters pending a favorable ruling from the Arizona Supreme Court. These agreements are fully enacted and ready for implementation.

towards the voters' mandated

Since April of 2018, Pinal County

roadway projects public and with transportation programs, approximately \$2 million more being collected each month. While awaiting the decision by the Arizona Supreme Court, all collected funds continue to be frozen in escrow and unavailable for use for these critical needs. Furthermore, as time continues to pass, inflationary pressures continue to increase the costs of each of these projects and programs.

With each passing day voters ask about the status of their sales tax funds. It is impossible to refund those taxes to the taxpayers who paid the taxes.

It has been a year to the day that the Arizona Supreme Court heard this case. Deciding the case expeditiously will allow the taxes to be used for the county-wide projects and programs the voters authorized.
