



Ak-Chin Council hosts first Community Meeting of 2022

January 31, 2022, Ak-Chin Tribal Council held their first virtual Community Meeting of 2022, with membership obtaining access to attend online.

The meeting started around 6pm with opening remarks and a prayer from Chairman Robert Miguel. Chairman reminded everyone about the last meeting held in 2021. He also provided a brief update on the current status of Covid in the Community, as well as commending everyone for testing and doing their part to help family members and keep the Community safe. Chairman then introduced the presenter for the evening.

The agenda listed one presentation by Purchase Referred Care Manager, Connie Miguel. Mrs. Miguel gave the community a couple of PRC updates for the month of January. The presentation started with a few technical issues, but soon Connie was able to proceed. A

PowerPoint presentation was made available for everyone to see during the meeting with assistance from Council Secretary, Vicki Smith.

Connie began by pointing out updates for the month. She first explained that Gila River approved referrals from 07/01/2021 – 12/31/2021 have been transferred to the Ak-Chin Indian Community.

What that means is any patients that were seen at Gila River and had a referral issued to Gila River Purchase Referred Care department and were approved through Gila River Purchase Referred Care department, they were transferred as of January 1, 2022 to Ak-Chin.

Moving forward, any services rendered from that approval of the authorization, the billing should be issued to the Ak-Chin Indian Community instead of Gila River.

She provided an example of

an approved referral letter from 2021 with services provided in January 2022. She also explained that they did an outreach to the providers notifying them of the change of the new billing to be sent to Ak-Chin as of January 1.

“We issued a letter to each of the providers that had an approval for those months of 2021, and the letter was provided and mailed to their billing department to advise them that all services as of 1-1-2022 be mailed to the Ak-Chin Purchase Referred Care department.”

Connie provided an example of the letter sent out to providers of all purchased approved referrals.

Connie then provided an update on the letters that her department also sent out to the patient, which is addressed to the member and explains the management of the program through Ak-Chin Purchase Referred Care and records

Ak-Chin Farms held a luncheon on January 18, to celebrate the retirement of Steve Coester.

Held at Ak-Chin Circle Elements Event Center, Steve was surrounded by family, friends and co-workers as they all took the opportunity to wish him well on this deserving occasion. Ak-Chin Chairman Robert Miguel and Councilmember Lisa Garcia were among the speakers for the event.

Chairman Miguel talked about Steve's 37 years of service to the community and how he has helped build the farm to be a successful operation. “Steve Coester was not only a hard-

working Farm Manager, but always had the best interests of the Farm and Ak-Chin Indian Community in mind. He was able to continue the success of our farming enterprise and built true relationships with contractors, enterprises and others which created a greater identity and recognition to the farm.”

“We’ve had a number of visitors and guests who’ve visited the community the past few years, and one of the most popular requests were for a tour of the Farm with Steve. I actually had a couple of communities who reached out to me to see if they could sway Steve away from Ak-Chin and become their Manager.”

2022 Next Level Planter Clinic held at Harrah's

January 25-27, over 500 farmers from across the country attended the Dowdy Crop Innovations (DCI) Next Level Planter Clinic at Harrah's Ak-Chin Event Center.

Clinic instructors Randy Dowdy and David Hula, who are known throughout the farming community as two of the highest-yielding crop growers in the world were the main presenters. Both men travel the country sharing what they have learned with other farmers, helping them take their farm to the Next Level of yield and profitability.

When speaking with David Hula he shared goals of the Planters Session, “It's all about learning and we're trying to (ensure) growers get a chance to work together and network across the country so growers

from south can help guys in the north, and neighbors that don't know each other that live in the same state, can help themselves. With the common goal, to try to make more bushels, so we can hopefully make more revenue...because we've got to feed the world.”

Each day there were two groups that rotated, half would attend outdoor demonstrations and classes held in the fields of Ak-Chin Farms, while the other group had the opportunity to attend hourly presentations, as well as visit the exhibitor booths inside The Event Center. Only Next Level growers were allowed to attend the event.

Randy Dowdy shared in a video at growersclinic.com, “We discuss yield maps, soil samples, tissue samples, how to set up a planter, how to set

up a combine, when to spray, what to spray, how to spray, products to buy. We cover it all and we teach them everything we know.”

There were twenty vendors set up inside The Events Center to showcase equipment and products. Key sponsors were also provided 1-hour time slots to give presentations throughout the day.

Field demonstrations were held outside on Ak-Chin farmland, where 18 acres were set aside, reserved for demonstration crops in various stages of planting and harvesting.

Ak-Chin provided irrigation and even planted the crops for the different sponsor demonstrations. Ak-Chin also provided three planters and tillage equipment to

that indicate the patient has an approved referral for the following specialty. It names the specialty outside Gila River Healthcare and explains that a letter to the provider is asking to bill Ak-Chin Indian Community PRC department for any services as of January 1, 2022.

Secondly, the referral authorizes when the referral will expire for that specialty.

Thirdly, as a reminder to the provider if there are any services rendered outside the approved facility it must obtain a preauthorization to the Ak-Chin Indian Community for authorization of payment.

If the specialty recommends service after the approved date, the member should schedule an appointment with Gila River Healthcare for a new referral, if possible.

It is highly recommended to request a new referral within 30 days, as it will allow for Ak-Chin's PRC to process the referral in a timely manner.

Connie pointed out that many specialists know if that continuance of care will be needed within that 30 days of expiration. If we receive those renewals 15-30 days prior to expiration date we can process it to the provider in a timely manner to ensure to there will be no interruption in care to the member.

The last update Connie shared was the hiring of new Benefits Coordinator, Amanda Maldonado.

Ms. Maldonado will be responsible for receiving the initial referral from Gila River and verifying alternate resources, such as AHCCCS, Medicare, Kids Care, etc.

She will begin to assist the members if they are eligible for any of these programs and will also be able to assist with the application process, and provide status of the application.

Amanda will be able to assist at times with making it an urgency, by calling AHCCCS and asking them to put in a rush approval due to the medical condition or the emergency that has been submitted.

Connie ended, "This month has been very productive for the Purchase Referred Program." She also said that since the program is brand-new they would like to share updates on a monthly or bimonthly basis.

After Connie completed her presentation she opened it up for any questions, concerns or feedback from the community.

There were a few questions asked about how records will be kept and shared, referral denials and program for dental and orthodontia.

Council Updates were provided and included information on the following: Covid testing and immunization events, Covid reports from other tribes, zoom meetings with state, local and federal government, meetings with state representatives,

housing incident, minimum wage change, temporary dental benefits, department budget approvals, new scholarship program, sports betting at casino and off-community, environmental codes, department meetings, water litigations, capital projects, PRC, future PSA's, technical capabilities, home quarantines in community, information on omicron and delta variants, election year and voting methods, consultations, burial assistance and Southern Dunes highlights.

After Council was finished with their updates Chairman opened up the meeting for questions from the membership. There were many questions asked pertaining to; immunization and testing events, Ak-Chin Circle status, employee merits, court hearings, IMT roles, responsibilities and emergency plan, police audit/review and recording/reporting, services for special needs, Maricopa incident, update on Council Code of Ethics, procedure for council investigation requests, Covid vaccine incentive for minors, and IMT appointment resolution.

After the member questions ended, Chairman once again thanked everyone for joining the meeting. No raffles were offered and meeting ended at approximately 815pm.

farm.

his years of service

experiences with Steve
throughout the years.

Chin Farm Manager

Farms was one of the
first farms in AZ to
install linear sprinkler
irrigation systems.

It was Steve's passion
and dedication to trouble
shoot the sprinklers and
make them work. Steve
worked with engineers
from the sprinkler
manufactures to improve

how the sprinklers
operate and make them
perform efficiently for
the crops grown on the
farm. The adoption
of sprinkler irrigation
early on has put the
farm in a great position
to efficiently utilize the
irrigation water delivered
to the farm.

Steve will receive a
plaque thanking him for
37 years of work with
the farm and a jacket
with the farm logo on it
once they arrive.

Damian shared, "I would
like to wish Steve many
great years of enjoyment
with family and friends
to come. I am thankful
to have the opportunity
to work with Steve on the
Farm. Steve as you move
to retirement know that

The Ak-Chin Indian
Community is
seeking professional
archeological firms to
perform a comprehensive
Archaeological
Phase Program for
gathering and surveying
documentations related
to the compliance
with Section 106 of
the National Historic
Preservation Act (NHPA)
and the Arizona State
Historic Preservation
Act (SHPA). The
Project Areas totals
approximately 126.3
acres and are located
throughout the Ak-Chin
Indian Community
("The Community").
Archaeologist as the
Principal Investigator
must be qualified under
an Arizona Antiquities
Act (AAC) permit.
The field supervisor
overseeing the survey
must meet AAA
permitting standards.

I. Background

The Community is
using ARPA funds
for approximately
13 (Thirteen) capital
projects within the
attached Overall
Projects Map, where
archeological services
are to be performed
within the project area.
Majority of the projects
are on disturbed lands.
Various capital projects
range from sewer/water
improvements to fiber
optic improvement to
a warehouse. Services
needed are in three phase
and will depend up on
the findings, if any from
SHPO to what phase
level is required within
the project area.

II. Project Description – Scope of Work

The selected consultant
team will be expected to
complete the following
minimum Scope of
Work:

Phase I

Consultants will
investigate all land area
project boundaries by
conducting "pedestrian"
surface collection and
subsurface testing.

i.e. shovel testing.
Investigation must be
fully justified in the draft
and final reports.

This phase will take
place after responds from

Archaeological Testing and Evaluation

Consulting Team will
revisit an existing or
recently identified
archaeological site

Phase I survey and
includes performing
further subsurface
investigations. Further
testing of archaeological
sites is in order to
completely understand
the potential of the site
to produce significant
archaeological data. The

data to firmly determine
if the project area is
significant enough to
warrant avoidance or
mitigation.

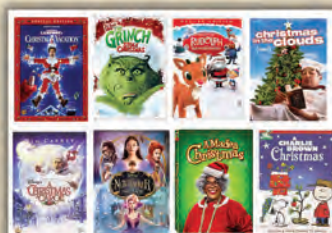

use for demonstrations and educational purposes.

During the outdoor sessions, growers learned about crop protection, fertilizers, how to make the soil better; with the main goal of growing higher yield crops of corn, soybean and wheat. Sponsors like John Deere, Fendt, Pioneer Seed and Precision Planting were also on hand to showcase their new equipment and products.

In addition to the presentations held inside Harrah's, attendees enjoyed all meals included in the clinic, the opportunity to mingle and talk amongst one another, as well face-to-face meetings with vendors, obtaining educational resources and demonstrations from the various exhibit booths.

Bus transportation was also provided to transport

attendees back and forth from the farm demonstrations to the indoor sessions at The Events Center.

When asked why they chose to hold their Planter Clinic at Ak-Chin, Next Level staffer Brian Mattix shared, "We wanted to have an event where we could go out and do field work."

He also explained that January-February would be the best time, because a lot of the farmers would be in the fields starting mid-March and April.

"So, we had a really small window to try to get everyone together and the problem is trying to find place to be in field setting that must be dry."

After doing much research they chose Arizona, and Maricopa specifically, as they held their first clinic here in

2020, at Harrah's with their field events at the University of Arizona Agriculture Center.

When planning this year's Clinic Brian shared that they wanted to have the field events closer and when working with the Harrah's Events team, they suggested Ak-Chin Farms.

"We wanted something that had to be dry... and since you have irrigation we wanted to cover crops to plant into... so you guys fit the bill for all that." Brian also shared, "It's been a good experience working with Damian... and we're very happy."

The Next Level program is a 3-year commitment where hundreds of growers nationwide learn from two of the highest-yielding farmers in the world, Randy Dowdy and David Hula.

Each Next Level grower benefits from four 2-day farm camps every year, a dynamic software system customized to the industry, and a community of other growers to support them well beyond the program. There are 14 locations around the US that offer the farm camps.
