



July Community Meeting

The Monday July 25th Community Meeting, although lengthy, did not have many topics as there were no presenters on the agenda.

The meeting began with Chairman Robert Miguel welcoming everyone and a blessing provided by Community Elder, Mildred Narcia.

All Councilmembers were in attendance and shared their respective reports for the month for the 20+ members in attendance and those logged in virtually.

Councilmember Delia Carlyle led off with her report, encouraging everyone to get out to the polls to vote, followed by discussion on healthcare in Indian Country and the Phoenix Indian Medical Center's new hospital master plan.

Councilmember Octavio Machado shared information about the Fresenius Dialysis center closure in the Community, and provided an update on the Law and Order

Code. He also talked about the emergency rental assistance, which is currently part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). Those funds will soon be depleted, and Octavio is asking membership to please provide feedback on the program, as Council is looking to find other sources of funding to continue or create another rental assistance program.

Councilmember Lisa Garcia talked about various meetings she and Council have attended, including an upcoming trip to Washington, D.C. to meet with Lobbyists and elected officials to discuss funding and grant options. She shared on the elder luncheon with Harrah's at the elder center, summer youth program year end celebration and Youth Council Kickball tournament. Lisa thanked everyone who participated in the 4th of July Celebration and the Back to School event, as well as reminding everyone to continue with COVID testing and vaccinations.

Vice-Chairman Lemuel Vincent also commented on the ARPA funds and rental

assistance program. He also discussed healthcare concerns and possibly partnering with University of Arizona and Tribal First on medical equipment. "We will be the first in Arizona and Indian Country to do something like this."

Vice-Chairman also mentioned potential partnership opportunities and more discussion on the unexpected closure of the dialysis center and the Community's plan to get another dialysis center initiated in the Community.

He also thanked the little league team for assisting with the 4th of July event, and Gila River Transportation for transporting members for dialysis treatments and hospital appointments.

Chairman Miguel discussed tours he and council have taken to other tribal healthcare facilities, learning about the process and difficulties each tribe hurdled in order to provide healthcare facilities in their communities. He also talked about meeting with

"It is not every day that an elder turns 99 years old!" Leslie Carlyle-Burnett, Elder Center Director exclaimed.

"The Elder Center staff had the privilege of throwing Virginia Thomas a birthday party."

As Ginia walked from her home to the Ak-Chin Elder Center, next door, she was greeted by family and friends who all came out to help celebrate what she called her "Sweet 16th" birthday.

Ak-Chin Elder staff planned a very intimate event – as intimate as possible with COVID guidelines. They decorated the inside and outside of the center with beautiful purple decorations, Ginia's favorite color.

Happy 99th Birthday balloons floated along the entry to the center, with pink and purple decorations flowing in the dining area. Beautiful flowers and arrangements adorned tables and a great big Happy Birthday Banner with golden "99" balloons were set up behind her table.

You could definitely feel the love that surrounded Ginia at the center, as many motioned their well wishes to her, by "air hugs", and others showered her with gentle embraces and well-deserved birthday wishes.

She was also showered with gifts from family, friends and staff to celebrate her sweet day.

Ak-Chin Mumsigo was asked to play some chicken-scratch music to add some special excitement to the party. A delicious traditional meal with her favorite, chili stew, was served to everyone in attendance, with strawberry cake for dessert.

When asked how she felt about celebrating her 99th birthday, through translation from her son Erno, she shared that it was a "good day", and she was happy to have a "good mind, heart, and health."

Virginia was joined by her sons, Johnny and Erno, daughter Priscilla, daughter-in-law Carole and numerous grand and great-grandchildren.

Granddaughters Gwendolyn Lopez and Candida Upton shared a few memories of their Ga'ga'a (grandma), always taking care of them.

"My fondest memory of her (was) always being at her house and everyday was 5am breakfast, 12pm lunch, 5/6 pm dinner. She always made sure we ate... Watching her make ceimat (tortillas) and the smell of the lard as she is putting it in her bowl of flour. I can still picture her till this day making ceimat." shared Gwen.

Candida also remembers her grandma making three meals

her grandma making three meals a day for all of them and “how I was the first to sleep with her since I am the oldest grandchild.”

Gwen also recalled, “One time she wanted us to sleep with her in her bed and there was four of us. I think poopoo was a baby at the time, maybe about a year old, but we all slept with her and the next day she had a black eye, cause I guess we had knocked her off her bed, but she didn’t care haha...I think as long as we were there with her she didn’t care.”

She also shared some of

Ginia’s fondest things, like dancing.

“We had a dance for her (86th birthday) and she got out there and danced with my brother, I know she missed dancing and she enjoyed it. I miss seeing her dance.”

It’s great seeing Ginia still doing many things she loves, like going outside for walks or to sweep her porch, rake around her house and water her trees.

Her family is extremely blessed to have Virginia’s inspiration, energy and genes.

The Elder Center staff is grateful for being able to celebrate with Virginia and her family, “We thank the family for allowing us to provide Virginia with a 99th Birthday party; and special thanks to the Ak-Chin Mumsigo band.”

“She is the oldest elder in the Community and we wanted to recognize her for that.” Leslie added. “Virginia raised a beautiful family that has extended to grandchildren and great-grandchildren. What legacy she has given the Ak-Chin Indian Community. Skeg Masik Tas Gina! Your sweet 16!”

NOTICE OF COMMUNITY ELECTION

The 2022 Community Election will be held on **Saturday, November 19, 2022**, at the Ak-Chin Gym. The polls will open promptly at 6:00 AM and close promptly at 2:00 PM. This election will be to elect members to serve in the three (3) Council Member positions, as the terms of Lisa Garcia, Delia M. Carlyle, and Octavio Machado, will expire.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations are sought for Ak-Chin members who are interested in being a candidate to serve on the Community Council for a four (4) year term commencing in January 2023.

Nomination Forms will be available at the Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters through Vicky Smith or Marilyn Thompson, beginning **Friday, August 19, 2022** through **Monday, September 19, 2022** between the hours of 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM. Members may self-nominate. Candidates who are not self-nominated must accept the nomination in writing and the acceptance must be notarized. All Nomination Forms must be completed and received by not later than 5:00 PM on **Monday, September 19, 2022**. Nomination Forms must be returned to Vicky Smith or Marilyn Thompson at Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters.

PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT ALL CANDIDATES SHOULD BE INFORMED OF THEIR NOMINATION PRIOR TO SUBMITTING THE NOMINATION FORM.

AFFIDAVIT OF QUALIFICATIONS

All candidates will be required to sign a notarized Affidavit of Qualifications for Community Council Member. Affidavits will be available at the Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters Office through Marilyn Thompson or Vicky Smith, beginning **Wednesday, September 14, 2022** through **Monday, September 19, 2022**, between the hours of 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM. Affidavits must be completed and turned in no later than 5:00 PM on **Monday, September 19, 2022**.

ALL CANDIDATES MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING QUALIFICATIONS:

- Must be an enrolled member of the Ak-Chin Indian Community.
- Must be 25 years of age or older.
- Must have not been convicted of a felony in the past ten (10) years.
- Must have resided within the external boundaries of the Ak-Chin Indian Reservation for at least one (1) year prior to the upcoming election.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Any eligible voter who wishes to vote early or who expects to be absent from the Reservation on any election day, or who expects to be physically unable to go to the voting place on such day, may request an absentee ballot by either appearing in person as instructed below or by sending a letter to the Community Election Board at 42507 W. Peters and Nall Road, Maricopa, Arizona 85138. Absentee Ballots may be requested in-person from Vicky Smith or Marilyn Thompson at the Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters Office beginning **Thursday, October 20, 2022** through **Monday, November 14, 2022**, between the hours of 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM

Absentee ballots may be returned either in-person or by mail. Absentee Ballots which are returned by mail must be notarized and postmarked no later than **Monday, November 14, 2022**. In person drop off, of Notarized Absentee Ballots, must be turned in no later than 5:00 PM on **Friday, November 18, 2022**.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 5 of Article III of the Constitution provides that the members of the Community Council shall obtain the training required to properly perform their duties including, but not limited to, training on financial management and the conduct of meetings.

CODE OF ETHICS

Council Members are subject to a Code of Ethics, which is adopted pursuant to Section 8 of Article III of the Constitution.

Members are encouraged to verify that their name is on the Eligible Voter List. In order to be on the Eligible Voter List you must be 18 years of age or older and be an enrolled member of the Community on or before Election Day.

EXAMPLES OF QUALIFIED/DISQUALIFIED VOTES

QUALIFIED - Any ballot with at least one (1) vote.
DISQUALIFIED - Any ballot with more than three (3) votes.
NO WRITE - INS

PARENTS – CHILDREN WILL NOT BE ALLOWED IN OR NEAR THE VOTING POLLS.

Chairman Miguel discussed tours he and council have taken to other tribal healthcare facilities, learning about the process and difficulties each tribe hurdled in order to provide healthcare facilities in their communities.

He also talked about meeting with Chandler Dignity Health and their request for information to initiate tradition and culture in their facility.

He provided an update on the Sonoran Parkway, currently under construction just east of Harrah's, with hopes to have a ribbon-cutting June 2023, and shared on the ITCA Tribal sister tour of the Community, with the Biden Administration.

Chairman participated in the Native American Economic Development Conference, and was

invited to speak to new teachers at Maricopa Unified Schools, and will be speaking at the Native American Journalists Association conference in August. He also attended meetings for AIGA Tribal Leaders and First Things First.

He attended a meeting with other Arizona tribal leaders and University of Arizona President, Dr. Robert Robbins where it was announced that UofA will soon be offering free tuition for Arizona Native students, through the Arizona Native Scholars Grant.

Chairman was excited to report that the Community was finally able to send high school seniors to Hawaii once again, after a two-year pandemic break, and also congratulated Ak-Chin boys and girls teams for representing and participating in the 2022 Native American Basketball Invitational.

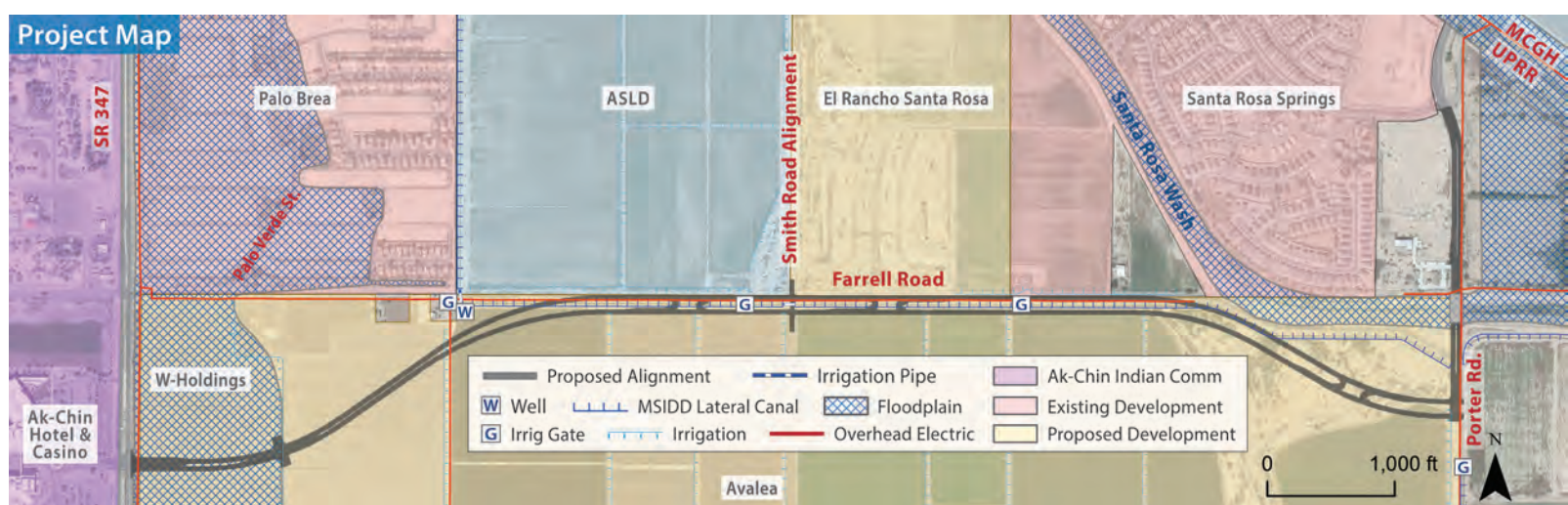
After Chairman's report the meeting was opened for the Member Q & A. Questions included: concerns on Arizona's water drought and water conservation efforts in

the community, utilities and water comparison reports on community and off-reservation member homes, setting limits on utility and water usage for community homes, member surveys on various community topics, healthcare, concerns, rental assistance program, council candidate residency requirement/qualification, status on Community Events positions and Tribal Gaming Director vacancy, comments/concerns on Indeed jobsite, Suspicious activity in Community housing/neighborhoods, Police reports and contact information, Housing Board policies/authority/resolution, and Council-Housing Board work session.

Once the Q & A ended, raffle winners were announced and the meeting ended around 10 pm.

Project Applicant/Harrah's Ak-Chin Casino and Resort Director of Finance and Administration, Bambi Johnson, is requesting Preliminary Site Plan approval for the Harrah's Ak-Chin Casino and Resort Cellular Distributed Antenna System (DAS) Network Deployment.

The project consists of:

- Cellular DAS Network Deployment for the Harrah's Ak-Chin Casino and Resort ("Harrah's");
- The project proposes to improve cellular network coverages within the Harrah's site by installing a DAS throughout the Casino and 12-Story Hotel Tower;
- A headend location has been determined and will be used to centralize all the Cellular DAS equipment and wireless carriers' equipment;
- All fiber and coaxial cable pertaining to the Cellular DAS will be routed through the Casino and 12-Story Hotel Tower to each antenna location; and
- No exterior modifications to the Casino and 12-Story Hotel Tower are proposed as part of the project.

Ak-Chin Indian Community General Plan Update

The Ak-Chin Indian Community ("Community") is seeking qualified consultants to conduct an update to the Community's 2003 General Plan. The current General Plan contains goals and policies for land use, transportation, cost of development, the natural environment, and preservation of cultural resources. The selected consultant will partner with Community staff, departments, the membership, and the Council to visualize and develop General Plan Elements and an implementation plan as part of the update. Additionally, the consultant will facilitate Community engagement, present recommendations, and solicit feedback.

I. BACKGROUND

The Community encompasses approximately 33 square miles of land, which designate areas of land for Residential, Public Use, Commercial, Industrial, Agricultural, Preserved Sensitive, and Riparian areas. The Community's General Plan is the tool for guiding the future of the Community. The General Plan Elements will establish development needs and sets the goals and objectives together with the land use map, to direct future development.

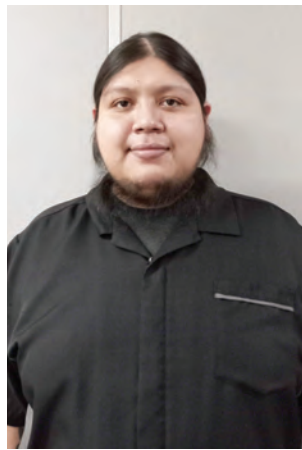

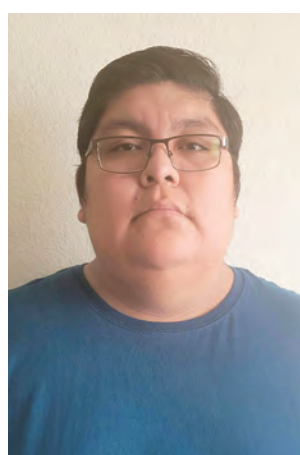

Frequently Asked Questions

Who can utilize Ak-Chin tribal transit services?

Any individual seeking transportation to or from Ak-Chin can utilize our services. This service is provided free of charge. Any individual seeking to ride alone must be over 10 years of age or accompanied by a rider over 15 years of age.

Where do I go to get on the bus?

We come to your residence in Ak-Chin. We can pick up and drop you off curbside at your door.

My child is being sent home sick from school, can you provide transportation? Yes. Transit can provide services to and from Ak-Chin Preschool only. If they are under ten years of age then Transit will have to pick up an adult that you are sending first and then the child from school. If no adult is available to go to the school for a passenger under ten years of age, then we will be unable to provide transport.

Can I receive rides to work?

Yes. We are open from 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday through Friday. You can schedule up to seven days in advance.

Where can I go?

Anywhere in Maricopa or Ak-Chin as long as it is within 5 miles of Ak-Chin boundaries. This includes shopping, dining, doctors' offices and other appointments. Please note: Ak-Chin Tribal Transit will not go to residences in Maricopa at this time. Only Public destinations.

How many times can I ride a day?

At this time there is no limit to the amount service Ak-Chin Tribal Transit is willing to provide if it can be appropriately accommodated. Please call into dispatch and advise us of your needs.

What if I need to cancel a ride?

You are urged to cancel a scheduled

ride as early as possible. We ask for a 15 minute notice. If a 15 minute notice is not given, you will be considered a no show. Reliable and on time transportation can be difficult to achieve when proper protocols are not followed.

What are your hours of operation?

Office hours are 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday through Friday. The Transit Department observes many Ak-Chin recognized holidays. If you have questions on whether or not Transit will be offering services on a particular day, please contact us.

How much notice do you need to schedule Transit Services?

We recommend that you make your reservation at least 2 hours in advance of your requested pick-up time. You may make a reservation up to 7 days in advance. Last minute requests may be accommodated if the schedule permits but may not always be available. Can employees be picked up from one department and taken to another department?

Yes. Please contact the Transit Department and schedule services.

Are the Transit vehicles wheelchair accessible?

Yes. Transit Staff are properly trained to provide this service to our residents. Each vehicle is equipped with four ratcheting WTORS and proper lap and shoulder restraints. Please let the Transit Department know over the phone if those services will be needed.

What if I need services that are not currently being provided?

If there is a service that you currently would like to receive and we are not providing it please let us know. The only way we can change our current structure and focus our services on the community, is to have feedback on what is really needed by the community.


