August Community Meeting

August 29, Ak-Chin Tribal Council hosted the August Community Meeting, at Ak-Chin Circle, Elements Event Center, where members gathered both in person and virtually for the 2-hour meeting.

With no presentations scheduled for this month the mic was handed over to Council, for their monthly reports and Member Q&A session.

Councilmember Lisa Garcia, first read updates from Councilmembers Delia Carlyle Octavio Machado, who were both absent from the meeting.

Councilmember Garcia then began sharing her update, which included attending the First Things First meeting where they are looking to revise the governance policy, which provides guidance on how group conducts meetings, businesses,

and their reports. She

also attended the First Things First Tribal Connects meeting.

The First Things First group is also working on a strategic plan for the regional council, focusing on quality care, educating families and caregivers, connecting families to resources and teaching the importance of the "early years" meaning from birth to five years of age. She also attended the Early Childhood Summit, and sat in virtually to listen and learn different topics revolved around childcare, education, and meeting the needs of tribal communities.

Councilmember Garcia participated in monthly community distribution COVID-19 testing, and various work sessions with departments and enterprises. She also informed that they would be working with department budgets.

Community member, Zylen recently selected attend the first-ever Native American All-Star Baseball showcase, hosted by the Atlanta Braves and 7G Foundation.

Zylen was among an elite group of 50 Native American high school baseball players to attend the two-day showcase that included a pro-style workout and game, held at Truist Park, July 16-17, 2022.

The pro-style workout focused on defensive work, fielding, throwing, catching and batting, followed by a Home Run Derby for selected batters.

Scouts from many major universities, and Atlanta Braves were on hand to at least ten pitchers and two catchers. Coaches were former Major League Baseball players; Marquis Grissom, Johnny Estrada, Marvin Freeman, and Lou Collier.

Zylen said he was selected through his play and education at Sherman Indian School in Riverside, Ca. He shared playing time at third base and outfield.

decided to stay in the US.

She was hired on at Harrah's Reno, then she accepted a generous offer to go work for the competition. She would later be contacted by Anthony Sanfilippo, former Regional Manager for Harrah's Reno. He let Angie know about a Food & Beverage position at Harrah's Ak-Chin that he felt would be the "perfect role" for her, so she applied.

"I interviewed and I liked what I saw, and I thought this would be a good fit, so they offered the job and I took it."

When Angie started working for Harrah's Ak-Chin she was asked by Geoff Andres, Harrah's General Manager at that time, to join him and take a language class that was being offered to employees. Little did she know that class would open the door to so many more learning opportunities and the beginning of many relationships.

Angie excitedly discussed her first language class, taught by her first "Maşcamđam" Sally Antone. (teacher) She said the class was very interesting. She felt that she adapted well to learning the language as she could relate it to the other three languages she spoke, English, Spanish and Tagalog (Filipino).

shared her Angie also commitment and dedication by participating in the many community events, such as the Masik Tas parades or Elder Meals and events. "We always participated in the events and contests through the years."

But her favorite story is the O'odham language classes. As she got better she would use her teachings during presentations.

"When we would do our

council presentations I would write out what I was going to say in O'odham, and I'd ask (language) to please check and make sure I did it right... then I would go up there and say "Añi Taicu Eg Lial," and they would all laugh... because it was like capital time and I had to tell them I needed money."

She is looking forward to traveling with her husband retiring. Although, she knows she will need to stay busy. She also plans to volunteer at her church. teaching catechism. "I loved doing that, because its just so enriching watching these kids making their first confession... It's time to give back, so I'm going to call and sign up."

"I have been so fortunate become an unofficial member of the Ak-Chin Indian Community, building relationships, getting to know people... the community treasures so much of what I believe in, the relationships and valuing elders, valuing children, that's how I grew up. We always had such a respectful title to elders we didn't just say their names." She also credits the hospitality that she grew up with as

being very similar to that of the community, as well as all the "relationships I built with Sally Antone and Delia (Carlyle) and people I've known through the years.

grateful (for) blessings that I received, its been a terrific career (and) the blessings have way outnumbered the challenges, and the challenges have all been learning opportunities. So, they've made me a much better person. Through the years I've learned to be a teacher, I've been a teacher who cares, a teacher who establishes relationships and makes them lasting because that's what it's all about."

She plans to keep in touch with her friends here in the Community. "Sally was my first "Maşcamđam" and she was the one who introduced me to the Ak-Chin culture. It wouldn't have happened if she didn't open the doors and then through her I met everybody else and got more involved."

The 2022 Community Election will be held on Saturday, November 19, 2022, at the Ak-Chin Gym. The polls will open promptly at 6:00 AM and close promptly at 2:00 PM. This election will be to elect members to serve in the three (3) Council Member positions, as the terms of Lisa Garcia, Delia M. Carlyle, and Octavio Machado, will expire.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations are sought for Ak-Chin members who are interested in being a candidate to serve on the Community Council for a four (4) year term commencing in January 2023.

Nomination Forms will be available at the Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters through Vicky Smith or Marilyn Thompson, beginning Friday, August 19, 2022 through Monday, September 19, 2022 between the hours of 8:00 AM - 5:00 PM. Members may self-nominate. Candidates who are not self-nominated must accept the nomination in writing and the acceptance must be notarized. All Nomination Forms must be completed and received by not later than 5:00 PM on Monday, September 19, 2022. Nomination Forms must be returned to Vicky Smith or Marilyn Thompson at Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters.

PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT ALL CANDIDATES SHOULD BE INFORMED OF THEIR NOMINATION PRIOR TO SUBMITTING THE NOMINATION FORM.

AFFIDAVIT OF QUALIFICATIONS

All candidates will be required to sign a notarized Affidavit of Qualifications for Community Council Member. Affidavits will be available at the Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters Office through Marilyn Thompson or Vicky Smith, beginning Wednesday, September 14, 2022 through Monday, September 19, 2022, between the hours of 8:00 AM and 5:00 PM. Affidavits must be completed and turned in no later than 5:00 PM on Monday, September 19, 2022.

ALL CANDIDATES MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING **QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Must be an enrolled member of the Ak-Chin Indian Community.
- Must be 25 years of age or older.
- Must have not been convicted of a felony in the past ten (10)
- Must have resided within the external boundaries of the Ak-Chin Indian Reservation for at least one (1) year prior to the upcoming election.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

Any eligible voter who wishes to vote early or who expects to be absent from the Reservation on any election day, or who expects to be physically unable to go to the voting place on such day, may request an absentee ballot by either appearing in person as instructed below or by sending a letter to the Community Election Board at 42507 W. Peters and Nall Road, Maricopa, Arizona 85138. Absentee Ballots may be requested in-person from Vicky Smith or Marilyn Thompson at the Ak-Chin Tribal Headquarters Office beginning Thursday, October 20, 2022 through Monday, **November 14, 2022,** between the hours of 8:00 AM – 5:00 PM

Absentee ballots may be returned either in-person or by mail. Absentee Ballots which are returned by mail must be notarized and postmarked no later than Monday, November 14, 2022. In person drop off, of Notarized Absentee Ballots, must be turned in no later than 5:00 PM on Friday, November 18, 2022.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 5 of Article III of the Constitution provides that the members of the Community Council shall obtain the training required to properly perform their duties including, but not limited to, training on financial management and the conduct of meetings.

CODE OF ETHICS

Council Members are subject to a Code of Ethics, which is adopted pursuant to Section 8 of Article III of the Constitution.

to Chairman Miguel, he began his update sharing that the community got a visit from the San Carlos Apache Tribe to tour the Community. With Ak-Chin Farm Manager, Damian Murrieta alongside, Chairman Miguel gave San Carlos Apache Tribal Chairman Terry Rambler, members of the San Carlos Council, Carlos Farm Board and a few San Carlos staff members a tour of Ak-Chin. The tribe was very interested in the production and growth of Ak-Chin Farms.

Chairman continued speaking about August schedule, that included the Self Governance conference in San Francisco with Councilmember Carlyle, where he was a moderator for a few sessions at the conference. He met with the news staff from the Phoenix Indian Center, and shared that he and **Treasurer Brandon Peters** also met with the Super Bowl Committee, in preparation for the 2023 Superbowl which will be held in Arizona. 





What are your hours of operation?

Office hours are 7:00am to 6:00pm Monday through Friday. The Transit Department observes many Ak-Chin recognized holidays. If you have questions on whether or not Transit will be offering services on a particular day, please contact us.

How much notice do you need to schedule Transit Services?

We recommend that you make your reservation at least 2 hours in advance of your requested pick-up time. You may make a reservation up to 7 days in advance. Last minute requests may be accommodated if the schedule permits but may not



Boy George and Culture Club keep the crowd engaged

Their album, Colour by Numbers, sold more than 10 million copies worldwide and listed on Rolling Stone magazine as the 100 Best Albums of the 1980's, and included in the book, 1001

Albums You Must Hear Before You Die. The song "Time" is included on the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame's list of 500 songs that shaped rock and roll.

"Karma Chameleon" was the band's biggest hit, peaking No. 1 in the UK, as the best-selling single of 1983. It also peaked at No. 1 in the US for three consecutive weeks, ultimately topping No. 1 in 30 countries. It is one of the top twenty bestselling singles of the 1980's, selling seven million copies worldwide, with one of the most iconic images of Boy George on the cover.

Culture Club won BRIT Awards for Best British Breakthrough Act and Best British Group in 1983, as well as the Grammy for Best New Artist in 1984. "Karma Chameleon" won Best British Single in 1984, and the Billboard Music Awards Top UK Single, as well as the ASCAP Pop Music Awards for Most Performed Songs along with "It's a Miracle".

During a break, Josh joked a little about the long-awaited show that took three years to get here. "You know this is a sold-out show, right... I can't really brag about it though... we've been selling tickets for about three years."

Josh dedicated his "Hometown Girls" song to all the local girls in the audience and when he sang "Your Man" everyone in the audience was so enthralled to hear that deep-southern voice. "Long Black Train" and "Why Don't We Just Dance" sent out the same effect.

He also had fun promoting his "Josh Turner merchandise stand" located in the lobby. And while promoting the merchandise, he promoted one shirt in particular, a black t-shirt with an American Flag, saying a portion of the sale of that particular shirt would be donated to a charity, Operation Worship that is raising funds to provide Bibles to all service men and women and veterans across the world.

Josh Turner received a standing ovation in 2001, at the Grand Ole Opry when he debuted his song, "Long Black Train" which earned him a Platinum certification. The song was written as tribute to Hank Williams, Turner's inspiration.

"Your Man" was his first number one single and the title of his second album, which also went Platinum and continued his second number one, "Why Don't We Just Dance". Your Man was

also nominated for a Grammy for Best Country Album and Best Male Country Vocal Performance.

Josh Turner was invited to become a member of the Grand Ole Opry on September 29, 2007. He was inducted by Vince Gill on October 27, 2007. He fulfilled his long-standing dream to cut a gospel album in 2018, I Serve a Savior, which debuted at number two on Billboard's Country and Christian charts.
