Events were tightly planned for pretty much all of December, beginning with a spiritual run and traditional games on December 4, followed by the ever-popular All-Indian Elder Chair Volleyball tournament on December 7.

The weekend December 9-10 welcomed an All-Indian Adult Co-ed Volleyball tournament, Fun Run/ Walk, Light Parade and Ak-Chin Youth Council events.

December 16-18 had a jam-packed schedule, Basketball with Tournament, rodeo carnival/fun events,

zone and petting zoo. There was a line up of great entertainment to get everyone feeling festive, from traditional dancers, singers and chicken scratch bands to Latin Grammy Award winners Kumbia Kings and Grupo Metal.

Ak-Chin Masik All-Indian Men's and Women's Basketball Tournament had close to 30 teams coming to the community, with games starting on Thursday, December 15.

Sunday's games went well into the evening with Ballhogs winning the women's championship, Outsiders placing second, and Unknowns

For the men's tourney Warriors won championship, second place was Ruff Ryderz,










WHAT IS THE FLU?

- Influenza (flu) is a contagious respiratory illness caused by influenza viruses that infect the nose, throat and lungs
- Flu is different from a cold, and usually comes on suddenly
- Wearing a mask can prevent the spread of the flu
- The CDC recommends you can wear a mask inside public places like grocery stores and movie theaters at any time

DID YOU KNOW?



- Influenza and RSV activity is high and influenza continues to increase rapidly
- More than ten times more flu cases reported the week of December 12, 2022 than in an average year
- Rise in respiratory illnesses sparks long emergency room wait times statewide GRHC Influenza positive tests 7 times higher season to date than last year at this time
- Influenza cases are higher and hitting earlier this year than the last 4 years
- 1980% higher number of flu cases compared to last year's flu season

HOW DOES THE FLU SPREAD?

- Flu viruses are thought to spread mainly by droplets made when someone with flu coughs, sneezes or talks
- These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people nearby
- A person also can get flu by touching something that has flu virus on it and then touching their mouth, eyes, or nose

ARE FLU VACCINES SAFE?

- Flu vaccines have an excellent safety record
- Millions of people have safely received flu vaccines for decades
- Flu shots and nasal spray flu vaccines are both options for vaccination. Different types of flu vaccines are licensed for
- Each person should get one that is appropriate for their age
- CDC and the American Academy of Pediatrics recommend an annual flu vaccine for all children 6 months and older




