

Ak-Chin Fire Chief Cecil Peters Retires after 36 Years of Service

Friends, family and coworkers came together on January 10, to honor Chief Cecil Peters, who retired from the Ak-Chin Fire Department after dedicating 36 years of

service.

The retirement party was set up as a surprise for Cecil. Although, he may have caught on about the party, he was definitely surprised to see so many come out to celebrate, including former Ak-Chin Fire Chiefs, Bill White and Michael Long.

Cecil started his career with Ak-Chin Fire in April 196, after serving in the U.S. Army. The department was just starting out, very small, with only six emergency medical techs/firefighters, under the direction of Ak-Chin's first Fire Chief Bill White.

Chief White recalled Cecil being a fast learner, willing to accept any job that was assigned to him. Bill credits Cecil for bringing Ak-Chin Fire into the modern age, with a beautiful new station, new eqi pment and wonderful personnel.

"You built a department that any community would be proud of, and I am proud of you for the job you have done Cecil. I hope you enjoy your retirement."

Chief Michael Long of El Mirage Fire, remembers Cecil in the early years of his career. He said Cecil taught him so much about the community, its history and the people. Cecil's deep devotion to his community always stood out to Chief Long, and they bonded over their devotion and eagerness to protect and serve the community.

Chief Long also credits Cecil's experience and knowledge in helping to move the department forward. He values

the professional relationship and friendship that they both continue today.

Maricopa Fire Marshal, Eddie Rodriguez knew Cecil through school, his commitment to family and their careers in fire service. Both started their careers about the same time, Cecil with Ak-Chin and Eddie Maricopa Volunteer Fire. Eddie shared how both departments have supported one another over the years to make Maricopa and Ak-Chin better places to live and be safe. Eddie also congratulated Cecil on his appointment to Ak-Chin Council.

"I know that you will be like you were in the fire department, very loyal, committed, honest. You have leadership and they all have that respect for you... I wish you luck in your nek endeavor as a newly elected

"Every time the fire chief position opened, I encouraged him to apply for it", Barbara

She's watched over the years as he's transitioned from firefighter to captain, to fire marshal to fire chief. She says though his titles have changed over the years his devotion to his community and to his firefighters never wavered.

Ak-Chin Chairman Robert Miguel talked about Cecil continuing to move forward and being an inspiration to all.




After the Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation, Opening Remarks were provided by the Honorable Warren Petersen, Senate President and the Honorable Ben Toma, Speaker of the House.

Three Arizona Tribal leaders addressed their concerns to the joint session of the Senate and House of Representatives, discussing various issues important to their communities.

Speakers included; Chairman Terry Rambler of the San Carlos Apache Tribe, Chairwoman Tanya Lewis of the Yavapai-Apache Nation and Chairman Timothy Nuvangyaoma of the Hopi Tribe.

Water concerns were prevalent in all three speeches, as well as land issues and economic development.

Attendance for the event was at an all time high, as 60 registered to participate. Indian Nations and Tribes Legislative day is way for indigenous communities across Arizona to come together to celebrate, it's also an opportunity to recognize tribal nations contributions to the state.

The Ak-Chin Indian Community is seeking professional services to conduct a master plan for the 810-acre, Economic Development Zone (EDZ). Located on the eastern edge of the Community, the EDZ is bounded by the Maricopa-Casa Grande Highway, Murphy Road, Peters and Nall Road and Russell Road. The master plan will assist the Community in the orderly development of the EDZ.

Project Description – Scope of Work

The selected consultant team will be expected to complete the following minimum scope items:

- A. Community Involvement Plan: The consultant team will work with a core group in developing the Master Plan. This task can be addressed by the collection of existing information, interviews with key stakeholders, Community meetings and other methods with the Project Team, the Planning and Zoning Commission and Ak-Chin Departments.




