Murietta shared the process on how the potatoes and pecans are planted, harvested and shipped to the different places here in Arizona. As such, the potatoes are designated to the Frito Lay plant in Casa Grande and local In-N-Out fast-food establishments, while pecans are shipped out of state and country.

After touring the processing plant, everyone loaded back onto the busses for a drive through the Community to see several housing areas. As we drove through the two newer housing areas in the farm subdivision, there was also a quick opportunity to view the pecan orchards just west of the main office.

The tour then made its way to the Community's newest subdivision in the main village, Desert Willow, where 75 new homes have been designated to be built. The main purpose in showcasing the housing developments was to give an overview of the Community's expanded housing project and share the high priority Ak-Chin households have for Internet Broadband service for adequate

The objectives would be to provide perform a comprehensive Archaeological Phase Program for gathering and surveying documentations related to the compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) and the Arizona State Historic Preservation Act (SHPA). The Project Areas contain 4 washes (Vekol-5 miles, Smith-9 miles, Santa Rosa-4 miles, and Santa Cruz- 2 miles) approximately 20 linear miles and are located throughout the Ak-Chin Indian Community.

The project funding comes from the Clean Water Act 319 grant, with requirements in providing "Fair Wages".
