Ak-Chin Parks and Recreation department hosted a soft opening on December 23, 2025, from 10 am - 12 pm.

Community members, employees and residents, were invited to celebrate the holiday debut, of the newly renovated Milton "Paul" Antone Memorial Park and to mark the successful completion of

the Parks Improvement Project (PIP) for the renovation of both Antone and Hohokam Parks.

Parks and Rec added an Ugly Sweater Party to the festivities, that included a luncheon of hotdogs and hamburgers. "We want to see you there in your most festive (and tackiest)

holiday gear!" the email invite suggested. "Come explore the new spaces, enjoy the holiday spirit, and help us kick off this soft opening with a bang."

Construction began on April 28, 2025 for the MPA Park and June 2, 2025 for Hohokam Park. Both parks received upgraded landscaping,

S-kubjuv Ju:dam started off strong with a few wins, but fell short in the tournament.

This was the team's first time participating in a 35 and up toka tournament.

The teammates that got to experience this year's 35 and up tournament mentioned how much fun it was to play, but were not looking forward to being sore after.

The new playground made by Landscape Structures from Minnesota features two separate play areas for ages 2-5 and ages 5-12, ensuring age-appropriate, safe, and engaging play experiences for everyone.

new ramadas/shading and fences.

New park signage was added to Milton "Paul" Antone Memorial Park.

A featured addition was a cement pad with traditional and cultural designs where dancing can be held for performers celebrating Native American Recognition Day (NARD) and Ak-Chin Him-Dak's Celebration, as well as other community-based celebrations.

Both, Ak-Chin Fire department and Indian Health Services (IHS) inspected the completion of the project, and gave approval for Antone Park.

Both parks will be opened in the next few weeks, pending the Certificate of Occupancy from Pinal County.

The large shade sails will make the playground cooler during warmer temperatures.

### Here are the current park improvements/projects:

#### Milton Antone Park, Play areas

The new play spaces were thoughtfully designed to support healthy play, imagination, and community connection, and the community is thrilled to provide families with a place where children can learn, grow, and have fun together.

The Park underwent less extensive renovation, but the play area was made safer with new rubberized play surface, wheel chair accessibility and new shading covers.

The walking track around the park was completely replaced with new concrete curbs and stabilized granite surface for comfortable walks.

The skate park area had a major face lift, both sides.

safe, and engaging play experiences for everyone.

Each area includes modern, inclusive equipment that encourages outdoor physical activity, creativity, and social interaction.

The 5-12 playground has a tower structure with slides and climbers along with ground level climbers, spinners and musical instruments.

The 2-5 playground has a mix of slides, climbers, multi-use spinner, rockers and social hangouts. The poured in place surfacing makes for a soft landing and accessibility for all throughout both of the playground areas.

New trees were planted along the south side and crushed granite all around the park.

new artificial turf was installed all around, new trees and crushed granite areas.

New large ramada and two small ramadas were added, complete with heavy duty concrete picnic tables, and grills. New bleachers and shading were added for the soccer field.

The volleyball area now has new clean play sand. Lighting was improved with the addition of new pedestrian lights.

The restroom building was completely renovated with new fixtures, partitions, painted inside and outside.

New trees were planted along the south side and crushed granite all around the park.

#### Farms Park

Farms Park is currently in the design phase. Preliminary Site plan was approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

The Park may start construction in April of 2026, after budget approval and can potentially completed by 2026, year-end.

The Park will have security fencing and gates. The Park features will include new grassy playing fields, ramadas for picnic areas, full basketball court, restroom building with equipment storage. Parking spaces along Farm Lane will be added, both sides.

Friday, December 19th, rodeo participants, from young buckaroos to novice riders entered the Jr. Rodeo, with events beginning at 9 am. Young community member participants included: Lina Hamilton, Eliza Smith, Jaylene Lopez, Malakai White, Paislee White, Johnathan Enos, Oliver Peters, Emerson Antone, Caleb Ugalde, Pate Justin, and Michael Enos.

Caleb Ugalde placed 3rd in the 10-13 Ribbon Roping with a time of 13.64 and Oliver Peters received 5th place in the 6-9 Ribbon Roping with a time of 22.84. Participants in Friday afternoon's rodeo cinched up the buckle

a little tighter as the Bulls, Broncs, and Donks events began with bull riding, novice bull riding, women's steer riding and the wild donkey race. "Papago Studs" from Ak-Chin, with Nikolai White, Dominique "Patcho" White and Chizzum Justin took 1st place and all the cash for the Wild Donkey Race. On the main concert stage, concert goers were able to enjoy the popular chicken scratch band, Papago Warrior, also known as PDub.

Papago Warrior was followed by Los Sociales, a Tejano band from the town of Guadalupe, Arizona.

A number of licks from southern rock, chicken scratch, Hispanic, and country was what Chaka & Friends brought to their set, much to the delight of fans who attended the concert. Chaka from the San Carlos community, has been a fan favorite for many years while performing in the community.

Los Hermanos Cuatro, closed out Friday's concert series. Led by Pascua Yaqui Vice-Chairman, Peter Yucupicio, the Tucson based band, played a majority of their set, in dedication to the Grammy Award winning accordion extraordinaire Ramon Ayala.

As quick as you said "good night" to Friday, Saturday's celebration was upon us. Attendees were in for a treat as three professional cowboys entered in the Open Rodeo, team roping event. National Finals Rodeo qualifiers; Derrick Begay, Erich Rodgers, and Aaron Tsinigine all made their way to the community to showcase their skills.

In addition to the roping events, the crowd cheered on bareback, saddle bronc and bull riders, steer wrestlers, barrel racers and the Wild Horse Race.

Ak-Chin proudly cheered on two teams comprised of community members; Team Ak-Chin entered with; Nikolai White, Dominique "Patcho" White and Nicolas Anderson. The White brothers had just won the Wild Donkey Race the day before, so they were stoked going into the race.

Team "Let's Do It" with members; Ralston Justin and Marcus Stephens, were also ready to ride to the finish.

Once the chutes opened, it was a close race to the finish, but only one winner would be announced that day and it was Team Ak-Chin.

When the final act of the country concert series was ready to take the stage, a thunderous ovation greeted Tracy Lawrence as he walked onto the stage. Tracy quickly jumped into popular songs which included;

"Time Marches On", "Sticks and Stones",

"Alibis" and "I See It Now". The Academy of Country Music Award

A couple community vendors were set up selling clothing and nail art.

Meanwhile, children and adults stood in line, for the most part patiently, to get on the fast, spinning, upside-down and side-to-side rides that had thrill seekers screaming for more.

Saturday's concert series showcased a country lineup that began with Justin Biltonen, performing acoustic versions of songs he wrote. Many may not know this, but he is actually the bassist for Three Doors Down.

Callie Twisselman "wowed" the crowd with her voice as she also jumped on the acoustic guitar to perform with her band.

Walker Montgomery, the son of John Michael Montgomery and nephew of Eddie Montgomery of Montgomery Gentry, was in the lineup and gave a beautiful rendition of his father's hit, "I Love the Way You Love Me" and his own "She Don't Know" and "Out of Nowhere".

Grammy Nominee, DeAna Carter, famous for a number of songs, in particular "Strawberry Wine" gave a wonderful performance with her band, which featured husband Jim McPhail on guitar.

Kentucky natives Montgomery Gentry, took to the stage prior to the main attraction. Gentry, an American Music Award and Academy of Country Music winner, played favorites, "If You Ever Stop Loving Me", "Something to Be Proud Of" "Lucky Man", "Back When I Knew It All" and "Roll with Me".

Sunday also brought a new music set list to the Masik Tas stage, "Rock" with an intensely impressive lineup. To start it off Aravaipa of San Carlos started the rock show, with a unique blend of vintage rock, blues and country. The crowd grew as each new band started to play.

When local band DOGYARD hit the stage their crossover thrash metal caught everyone's attention, as many more joined the crowd to hear lead vocals Seven Garcia and the band that included community members Ralston Justin on guitar and Zachary Garcia on drums. In no time, the band captivated the crowd with their massive headbanging.

American rock band from Memphis Tennessee Saliya followed, with a hard rock/alternative metal style, with "Click Click Boom", "Ladies and Gentlemen" and "Your Disease".

Heavy metal rock band, Quiet Riot, founded in Los Angeles, were next to take the stage. As the crowd moved closer to hear their cult classic, "Bang Your Head (Metal Health)" and "Cum On Feel the Noize".

Lit, an American alternative rock band out of Orange County, California took to the stage to play their top hits, including "My Own Worst Enemy" and "Miserable". They have even dabbled with a little country, with "Fast" and "Back with You".

Once, headliner Fuel hit the stage the crowd was primed and ready to rock the night away. The post-grunge/hard rock/alternative metal band from Harrisburg, played all their hits.

"Hemorrhage (In My Hands)" was most requested song of the evening, and Fuel did not disappoint, saving the best for last before ending Masik Tas' first rock concert series.

their way over to where a merchandise shop was set up to mingle with supporters.

Following 2025 tour dates which included stops in Flagstaff, Phoenix, Tucson, California and Nevada, the Masik Tas performance was the last stop for the year.

Dogyard originated in September of 2021, when high school buddies Ralston Justin and Christian Roman shared their interests in the heavy metal/thrash music and the prospects of starting a band, it only helped the process that they shared the same instrument, which was instrumental and key of learning each other's style of play.

Slowly they recruited others to play in the band, which included bassist Ray Hernandez, who was also a classmate, and now a mainstay for the band. The group went through a couple vocalists before settling with current front lady, Seven or "Sev" for short.

In need of a drummer early this year, Justin encouraged the group to give a young and enthusiastic Ak-Chin percussionist, Zach Valles-Garcia, a shot. After receiving set recordings of the songs Dogyard played, Zach had short time to learn before performing a gig in Tucson. Following the Tucson show, Zach did so well, he was penciled in as the permanent drummer for the group.

Although, Dogyard is hitting on all cylinders for a great sound, they still

acknowledge room for improvement. "We love playing our music and especially enjoy how much those who follow us love it," Seven said. "But we know that we can get better and give our fans much more."

Here's a little snapshot of the band Dogyard:

Lead Vocalist - Seven - Seven hails from Phoenix, Arizona and has been singing for a couple of years now. She's been in the group for roughly three years and was given the opportunity to audition by Christian Roman.

Prior to Dogyard, she performed for other local acts in the Phoenix area. According to Seven, the name Dogyard was inspired by Justin and Roman who one day thought of junkyards and just added dog to the front of yard. Groups who have inspired her career, include Slayer and Sepultura. Performing at this year's Masik Tas was one of the highlights of her career.

"It was a very humbling and amazing experience to be able to perform in probably the biggest crowd we've played for," she said. "To see all the support, we had was wonderful and I want to thank each and everyone there for us."

Ralston Justin - Guitar - Ralston is a member of the Ak-Chin Indian Community, and is the son of Earl and Michelle Justin.

A self-taught guitarist who plays an ESP-LTD Snake Byte guitar, Ralston is one of the co-founders of the group, along with Hernandez.

Prior to Dogyard, he and Hernandez formed another band, but that quickly dissolved, before the formation of Dogyard. But the one true person who he keeps in his heart daily is his late uncle Kerlin "Gus" Justin, who was known as a metal guitarist back in his younger days.

"My uncle Gus who inspires me everyday to pick up the guitar and play to the best of my abilities," Justin said. "I have a photo of him in my guitar case that I carry with me at all times. He's who I look up to."

Playing in front of his family and friends is always an emotional and great time. "I want to thank everyone, especially my family, for coming out and supporting not just me, but us. It brings the best out of us when we see all that support."

Zach Valles-Garcia - Drums - Zach is member of the Ak-Chin Indian Community and is currently a Junior at Maricopa High School. He the son of Lisa Garcia and the grandson of Elizabeth Valles.

His inspirations include; Joey Jordison, the original drummer for heavy metal band Slipknot, Lars Ulrich of Metallica and The Rev of Avenged Sevenfold.

He credits his uncle, Blas "Sonny" Valles for getting him interested in drumming, as Sonny bought him a drum kit back when he was twelve years



old. "My uncle bought me those drums and I started to play and got a feel for it," Zach said. "So yeah, he was the one who got me started."

Although he just joined the group this year and is young in terms of putting his own mark on Dogyard's music, band members admit that he's grown leaps and bounds and has become a great drummer.

Christian Roman - Guitar - Plays a mix of lead and rhythm guitar and has been self-taught for the past nine years. Also, a co-founder, Roman lists Metallica, Slayer, Rage Against the Machine, Suicidal Tendencies and many of the guitarists who have played with Ozzy Osbourne.

He resides in Maricopa and attended Maricopa High School, where he met Ralston and Ray.

Christian is hoping that the groups base and performances expand just not locally, nationally. "We would love to continue branching out and playing in other states and with bands across the country. Our ultimate goal would be to see the world and

give back to our local communities through music."

Playing at Masik Tas and opening for Quiet Riot was a major treat as he's listened to QR since he was a child with his father.

"It was an awesome experience! We had a ton of family, friends and familiar faces who came out to see us and it felt awesome getting to play at a festival (Masik Tas) I grew up going to my whole life," he said.

"A big shout out to all the crew, stagehands, and staff that made the event possible! Everyone was super kind, welcoming, and helpful!"

Ray Hernandez - Bass - A seven-year experienced bass player, Ray also played guitar before picking up the bass.

Taking guitar lessons early in his life, helped him transition to the bass. Going into his third year with the band, he admires people who play with a guitar pick mostly, and attacks it like a guitar. But he also lists Jason Newstead of Metallica, Rex Brown of Pantera, Audie Pitre of Acid

Bath, and Gene Simmons of Kiss, inspirations.

Bass picks are key to many who play the instrument, but Hernandez prefers not to use one, such as his hero. Hernandez hopes that the band continues to be consistent, play bigger shows, sell more merchandise and continue to go upwards.

His dreams would be to open up for such groups as; Suicidal Tendencies, Cannibal Corpse, Frozen Soul, Deicide and Sanguisugabogg.

His mother thought he was lying when he told her that they would be opening up for Quiet Riot and Fuel, but reality set in and she was a "big" supporter at the show. Prior to the show Ray admitted that he had jitters before taking the stage.

"It was really scary, but really surreal, because I would like to say that was the most important show of my life. Playing in front of our hometown as well as just opening for very well-established bands, was a moment I wanted us to seize and really make the stage ours."
