



## Tribal Unity Impact Days

The Annual Tribal Unity Impact Days, which allows Tribal Nations throughout the United States to meet and discuss issues, concerns and highlights from Indian Country with Congressmen and Senators within the government, was held for the first time through a virtual WebEx.

Despite the virtual format, due to the COVID19 pandemic, the two-day event took place on September 11-12. Ak-Chin was represented by Chairman Robert Miguel during the September 11 session, with topics that included; Broadband Infrastructure & Technology, Health and Education.

Representing Congress during the Roundtable were Congressman Raul Grijalva (D) of Arizona's 3rd congressional district and Congressman Ruben Gallegos (D) of Arizona's 7th congressional district.

Chairman Miguel thanked and acknowledged both Congressmen for addressing "these important issues with Tribal Leaders today."

Chairman also shared how many communities have been affected by the pandemic. "Within the COVID19 pandemic, we must also keep

in mind that there are other health disparities that are affecting our people. Many key health programs have been affected, Tribes have had to lay off staff or shift other staff into positions just to carry out basic functions."

Chairman then asked "How can we ensure through federal funding or other sources of funds, that our health programs to treat health disparities are not negatively affected?"

Grijalva responded, "I think there's an issue of maintenance of effort to be compromised or reduced as a consequence of responding to the crisis that is before us... There were preexisting conditions in Indian Country when the pandemic hit, those preexisting conditions dealt with the health disparities. These disparities only worsened the issues facing Native Americans. Come January, Native Americans should have a front seat at the table when it comes to funding efforts to combat and provide the funding services needed during the pandemic. The funding has to be more robust than it is now and the efforts of providing more CARES act funding is not only a priority, but a must." Grijalva said.

## Community Pilgrimage offers faith and healing

Keeping the faith has been difficult for many, especially with the unfortunate events that have taken place due to COVID-19. But, Community members who have dedicated themselves to the yearly Malina Pilgrimage, are keeping their faith and tradition alive by doing a small pilgrimage around the Community.

"Unfortunately, with the pandemic situation global wide, it has altered our Religious, Cultural and Traditional practices." Vice-Chairman Gabriel Lopez shared.

"The Group that we usually walk with, the late Felix Antonebud's Group from the Tohono O'odham Nation, had to make a decision for this year's pilgrimage to Magdalena, Sonora, Mexico. Felixbud's sister Ana Antone and other coordinators of the pilgrimage had to take in consideration of the seriousness of COVID-19, not only for the Safety and Health

of the Walkers, but also to the residences of the towns that would host us on our journey."

The Ak-Chin group got together and encouraged one another to keep their prayers and faith in Saint Francis, by starting their own pilgrimage around the Community, during the week of September 29-October 3; during the time the walkers would have been on the pilgrimage. A rosary will be held every evening. There is also a traditional fire that will burn until the end of their pilgrimage.

The Ak-Chin Walkers start out every morning at 4am, beginning at San Juan Church, they head East on Farrell Road, then South on Court Street, and West on Farm Road, then North on Santos Road and East on Farrell, ending back at the church. The route is about 4 miles, and takes them about 1 1/2 to 2 hours to complete.

Other walkers are doing similar activities in their communities, while some are still planning

to make the Pilgrimage to Magdalena, Mexico.

Each individual has their own intentions of why they are walking, Praying for Strength, Good Health, Peace, Forgiveness, Guidance and Healing.

Lopez shared, "We, all have gone through some bad stuff for the right reasons in our lives, I am truly blessed with the many blessings that I have received, the guidance and strength. It has helped me to be a better individual, Husband, Father and Grandfather. It also gives me renewal, strength and faith in my Religious, Cultural and traditional beliefs. I have participated in the pilgrimage for the past 6 years, it is said that when you commit yourself to the pilgrimage, you have to commit yourself for four years."

Lopez added, "My Prayers have always been focused on my Family, Our Community, Our Young People, Our Elders, Our Employees. I also pray for

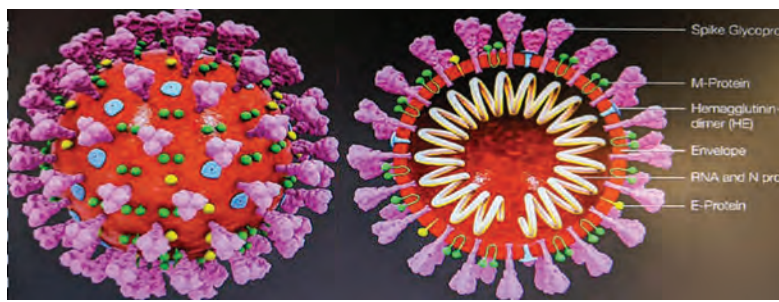

# Pesticide Safety while fighting Viruses like COVID-19

Yes, disinfectants are "pesticides", when the disinfectant is marketed and sold for use to kill viruses and bacteria on surfaces. U.S. EPA approved disinfectants will carry two (2) numbers to look for: an EPA Registration number (indicating EPA approval), and an EPA Establishment number (indicating where the disinfectant was manufactured).

As we work to contain and restrict the spread of COVID-19, the following guidelines for the use of disinfectants will help to reduce the potential for the spread of the virus:

- 1) Manage the potential spread of COVID-19 on surfaces in your home by routine cleaning. Each day clean common areas and high touch surfaces such as tables, countertops, light switches, doorknobs and cabinet handles. Hard non-porous surfaces that are visibly dirty should be pre-cleaned with soap and water before disinfecting.
- 2) Use a disinfectant – **ALWAYS read the label first before using pesticide products and follow the label directions.** Make sure to wear any personal protective equipment specified on the disinfectant's label such as chemical resistant gloves.
- 3) When cleaning an area that may be contaminated with the virus, use EPA-registered disinfectants that meet the agency's criteria for effectiveness against SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).
- 4) When using disinfectants on surfaces, make sure to have good ventilation and airflow.
- 5) Follow label instructions about cleanup of household chemicals including cleaning up spills and disposal of products.
- 6) Keep all household cleaners including disinfectants out of the reach of children.

Refer to the EPA.gov website for a list of EPA registered disinfectants for use against COVID-19. This list also includes some products that meet the EPA's more stringent criteria for effectiveness against harder-to-kill viruses and other emerging viral pathogens.

**List N: Disinfectants for Use Against SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19)**

All products on this list meet EPA's criteria for use against SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19.

**Finding a Product**

To find a product, enter the first two sets of its EPA registration number into the search bar below. You can find this number by looking for the EPA Reg. No. on the product label.

For example, if EPA Reg. No. 12345-12 is on List N, you can buy EPA Reg. No. 12345-12-2567 and know you're getting an equivalent product.

**Using Other Products**

If you can't find a product on this list to use against SARS-CoV-2, look at a different product's label to confirm it has an EPA registration number and that human coronavirus is listed as a target pathogen.

**6 Steps for Safe & Effective Disinfectant Use**

- Step 1: Check that your product is EPA-approved**  
Find the EPA registration number on the product. Then, check to see if it is on EPA's list of approved disinfectants at: [epa.gov/listn](https://epa.gov/listn)
- Step 2: Read the directions**  
Follow the product's directions. Check "use sites" and "surface types" to see where you can use the product. Read the "precautionary statements."
- Step 3: Pre-clean the surface**  
Make sure to wash the surface with soap and water if the directions mention pre-cleaning or if the surface is visibly dirty.
- Step 4: Follow the contact time**  
You can find the contact time in the directions. The surface should remain wet the whole time to ensure the product is effective.
- Step 5: Wear gloves and wash your hands**  
For disposable gloves, discard them after each cleaning. For reusable gloves, dedicate a pair to disinfecting COVID-19. Wash your hands after removing the gloves.
- Step 6: Lock it up**  
Keep lids tightly closed and store out of reach of children.

- **Cleaning** refers to the removal of germs, dirt, and impurities from surfaces. Cleaning alone **does not kill germs**, but by removing them, it lowers their numbers and the risk of spreading infection.
- **Disinfecting** refers to using chemicals, for example, EPA-registered disinfectants, **to kill germs on surfaces**. This process does not necessarily clean dirty surfaces or remove germs, but by killing germs on a surface *after* cleaning, it can further lower the risk of spreading infection in the future. Remember that disinfectants will need contact time (at least 30 seconds on the surface) to do the job effectively.

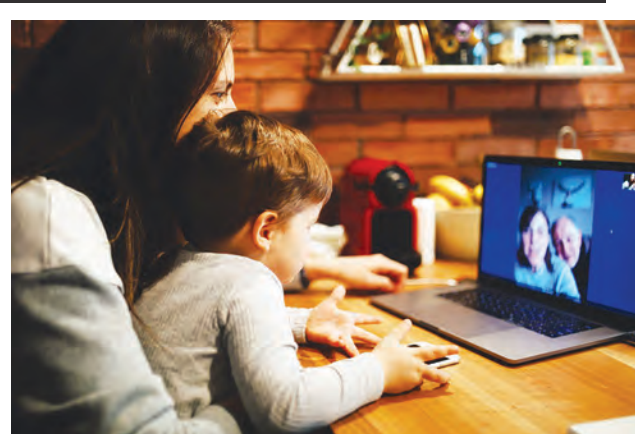

## Managing screen time for young kids during social distancing



As families continue to practice social distancing during the coronavirus pandemic and many parents remain at home with their young children, it's important to monitor the amount of time young children spend in front of a screen.

"Families should recognize that this is a unique time in everybody's lives," said First Things First's Senior Director of Family Support, Katherine Willard. "While access to technology has been a resource during COVID-19, it's important to remember that the best way children learn is through interactions with a trusted caregiver."

First Things First (FTF), Arizona's early childhood agency, knows that now, many families do not have the option to shield their child from a screen at all times. Instead, parents can follow some simple guidelines to manage screen time for their young kids.

The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends no exposure to screens for children 18 months old and younger. The exception is using live video chat so that children can connect with family and friends who are far away or who can't visit in-person because of social distancing. As the child gets older, families can use technology and interactive

media to strengthen relationships.

The recommendations say that between 18 months and 2 years old, you should limit the watching to educational programming with a caregiver. For example, if you're watching Sesame Street and Elmo is doing the happy dance, encourage your child to dance along. Find ways to interact with your child, based on what he is watching.

For children between ages 2-5, high-quality educational content is recommended for a limit of about an hour a day, the AAP says. Make sure that whatever your child is watching, that it is age appropriate. Even Disney movies, like The Lion King are not appropriate for young children. One of Willard's recommendations is the Arizona PBS app, which gives age ranges for their shows for young kids.

Ultimately, parents of toddlers and preschoolers should give themselves a break while trying to balance working from home and caring for young children, Willard said.

"Instead of focusing on what you can't do, focus on what you can do with your child after your work day is over," she said. Willard said she knows that sometimes the only option is to offer an educational video,

if parents have a video meeting or phone call that they must attend to, but they make a plan for positive interactions later in the day.

"Have them help you set the table or cook a meal," she said.

Turn off the television or computer, which is sometimes used as background noise, during dinner time.

"Talk about your day. You have another opportunity for that back and forth conversation during mealtime," Willard said.

As noted earlier, the one exception to screen time limits is live video chat, like FaceTime, Zoom and Skype, among others, which allow the kind of responsive interactions that are good for helping babies and toddlers develop language. When the baby communicates through nods, gestures or expressions, they are able to see that the person on the other end respond to them.

"On FaceTime, kids can have time with grandparents, who can play peek-a-boo, or sing songs, or even read a book to them," Willard said. "It's the personal connection that is really helping brain development. And it's so important to maintain that social connection during this time."

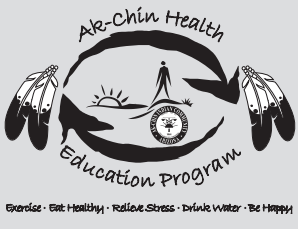

We are focused on minimizing risk and upon arrival all driver's will be wearing a face covering.

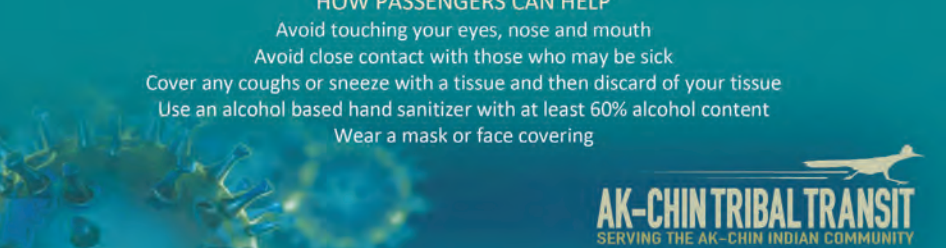
We are asking that passengers please wear a mask whenever possible while on the bus to reduce the risk of exposure.

provide a safe and healthful work place.

The Community also believes that it is in the best interest of all employees to take proactive steps to reduce the risk of COVID-19 exposure in the work place. Accordingly, Ak-Chin Tribal Council determined to commence mandatory COVID-19 testing and subsequent reporting of positive results. All 480 Community Government and Farms Employees will test for the remainder of this year, on a monthly basis in September, October, November, and December.

The Community has contracted with Steward Health Care System, LLC, to administer on-site tests to all employees. The tests are provided free of charge to employees. The schedule of testing should not affect any of the Community Department operations as employees are scheduled throughout the span of two to three days.

The COVID-19 testing is also available on a voluntary basis for Ak-Chin enterprises employees: Harrah's Ak-Chin Casino Resort, UltraStar Multi-tainment Center, and Ak-Chin Southern Dunes Golf Club.
